Member for Western Victoria, the Honourable Simon Ramsay officially opened the Meredith Recreation Reserve Irrigation Project at a civic celebration held on Monday 25 July 2011.

Golden Plains Shire was fortunate to receive State Government funding through Sport and Recreation Victoria's Drought Relief for Community Sport and Recreation Program towards the drought proofing of facilities at the Meredith Recreation Reserve.

Mayor of Golden Plains Shire, Cr Geraldine Frantz said that drought proofing local sports grounds and recreation facilities is vital to the social fabric, strength and wellbeing of all communities across the Shire.

"Irrigation initiatives such as this will ensure that more sports grounds in Golden Plains Shire are low-maintenance, drought-resistant and able to withstand more wear and tear," said Cr Frantz.

In addition to recently completed projects at Linton, Inverleigh and Smythesdale, the new infrastructure at Meredith will ensure local residents have more opportunities to play sport, despite the conditions brought on by drought. "On behalf of Council I would like to congratulate the community, particularly those involved in the grant application process and those who have contributed to in-kind works, on the achievement of this fantastic outcome." said Cr Frantz.

#### New Bridge in Whinray Road Meredith.

In the January flood this year, the original bridge in Whinray Road washed away in recent flood waters. The new bridge has recently been finished and the road is now reopened to traffic. The road connects the Morrison area with the Durdiwarrah area, and is well used as a through way to Melbourne and Geelong. The old bridge had a six tonne load limit on it, but the new bridge has been constructed with no limit needed, which allows for heavy traffic to use it. The end result has been well worth waiting for. The road was originally called Whineray's Road after the family who lived on the Morrison side of the creek.

The Shire is still working on flood damage to other crossings in the Shire.

Golden Plains Shire Council is pleased with the number of residents who participated in the recent community consultation for the Meredith Community Facilities Map. Ten local residents took up the opportunity to speak directly with Council officers at the recent drop in session.

Residents in Meredith were invited to indicate their preferred location for community facilities by plotting these on a map of the Meredith township during the initial consultation phase in April. 250 surveys were distributed via mail and at the Meredith Roadhouse and Community Centre.

Items of specific interest included discussion around the potential location of the Meredith Visitor Centre and Meredith Kindergarten. All feedback is currently being compiled and residents were encouraged to support their views by sending a written submission.





#### Vale Mavis Charlotte Griffiths

Mavis Griffiths was born on September 5, 1919, grew up at 33 Bell Parade, Drumcondra, Geelong and was the daughter of Les and Eileen Pettitt.

She studied dressmaking in the 1930's and worked at the

exclusive dressmakers Bryant and Lane and specialised in bridal wear.

She was engaged to Mervyn Griffiths from Meredith before he enlisted in the AIF and they married on July 15, 1944 during his 3 week leave from his wartime posting in Darwin

After WWII they purchased "Woodbank" at Mt Mercer.

They had a family of Peter and the late Alan

They farmed there successfully until the sudden death of Mervyn from a heart attack on May 9, 1988, aged 72.

Mavis moved into Wendouree and remained in that house until the day before her death on July 13, 2011.

She was a member of Meredith CWA and in 1983 she was Group Craft Leader for 23 branches of CWA at Geelong and also Craft Leader for Meredith CWA, so she was busy planning craft days and exhibitions. She was awarded a Life Membership of the CWA.

Her fine needlework earned her several state awards and acclaim at the Melbourne Show.

Mavis also taught craft at Woodburn State School for nearly 10 years and to students at Meredith State School for 5 years.

Some of the crafts she taught were sewing hems, fancy work stitches, weaving, making baskets, macramé, knitting, crochet,

using wooden pegs to make chairs etc, paper and silk flowers and Christmas decorations.

She gave a craft book each year to the school and signed it "from the honorary craft teacher" and she always attended the end of year school barbeque and concert.

Her family remembered her as being proud and confident, having old fashioned values and being strong on etiquette, being resourceful, that she always wore her long hair rolled up and pinned, that she loved her garden, that she loved her family especially her two grandchildren Jocelen and Luke and that all her life she ardently followed the CATS.

She handwrote beautiful letters and always carried an embroidered handkerchief, an umbrella

and a brooch she had had made herself.

Mavis was also talented at arranging flowers that she had handpicked from the garden.

A funeral service and Committal was held in Ballarat on Tuesday July 19.



#### **Edward Tonkin Sutherland**

Edward was the son of James and Grace Arabella Sutherland and grew up at "Spring Glen" on the Bamganie Road. He had married Elizabeth Ellen Cavey in 1909 and by 1916 when he enlisted for WWI they had 4 children and they were living at Durham Lead.

After the war he returned to his family at Durham Lead and they had four more children but family tell that he had been badly damaged, physically, mentally and emotionally.

His family remained in the Buninyong area but he died in Western Australia in 1952.

At the Leigh road Police Court on Wednesday, Frank Holmes, a drover, was summoned by the inspector of sheep, under the 49<sup>th</sup> section of the Scab Act, for driving sheep without notice through Moranghurk, Lethbridge, and the case being proved, he was fined £5 with 2s 6d costs, to be paid within 14 days. The drover was driving sheep, the property of Mr. Morton, of Mount Bolton, from Mr. M'Killops, Duck Ponds, to Mount Bolton. *The* Argus Saturday 4 October 1873

"William Linford, Meredith came to Victoria from England with his wife in 1841 and went to work as a bricklayer, afterwards going into farming and golddigging.

Next he worked in Melbourne as a stonemason, and was employed on the railways for twenty seven years. Eventually he settled down on Woodburn Creek, in the Meredith district, selected land, and since occupied himself in farming and in the development of goldworking in the vicinity."

"William was appointed to a position with the Victorian Railways in September 1859 as a repairer on the Western Lines.

He remained in the employ of the railways until he resigned and terminated his employment on May 15, 1885. His wife Sarah Linford {Payne} was appointed as a Gatekeeper with the Victorian Railways in November 1870

In 1887, William and Sarah were described: William Linford, father, residing at Meredith, Plate Layer. Sarah Linford, mother and nine children living with father whose wages is 39/- per week and this is their only means." *From a history of "William Barlee Linford, 1825-1905."* Supplied by Marg Cooper.

#### Pins and Needles

When I was growing up, my mother had a sewing machine that could be described most kindly as 'temperamental'. I've heard slightly less kind adjectives thrown at it, but to be honest they're a little too rude to type. I don't know exactly what happened to that awful old machine, though I'd be willing to bet it's been dumped unceremoniously in the bin, or maybe even set on fire. If Mum ever liked to sew, that beastly machine must have sucked all the joy out of it over the years.

It shrieked obnoxiously while it chewed up fabric and spat tangled threads. In the days before digital it somehow managed to destroy the picture quality on the telly every time the pedal was pressed. The needle was constantly jamming,

bending, snapping. Mum would curse, slam things and sit up half the night sorting out tangles and unpicking seams, but even with the worst of tools she managed to make beautiful things. My sisters and I wore gorgeous

handmade dresses, exquisitely smocked and embroidered, but the prettiest dress in the world couldn't convince me that sewing machines were anything other than stressful and scary. Whenever I got close to one, I'd remember the way my mother sighed through gritted teeth every time she

lifted her foot from the pedal and dragged the fabric out from under the jammed needle. It was a furious, fragile sound, the sound of a woman pushed to the edge by a heap of old metal and plastic.

When I got a little older, and began to accept I'm rather more fashion challenged than fashion conscious, I started to embrace all things shabby and thrifted. Caught up in the 'Make do and mend' movement, I fancied the idea of deftly churning out dresses from my lounge room, and asked for a sewing machine for Christmas a few years ago. I could tell Mum had her misgivings, but on Christmas morning there was a shiny new sewing machine with my name on it under the tree. I took it with me from house to house, but it never did much more than look pretty and collect dust. To tell the truth, I've always been a little bit scared of it.

Two weeks ago, I found a dress pattern and decided it was about time I conquered my sewing machine demons.

Scissors in hand and pins in mouth, I measured, snipped, pinned, hemmed, seamed, pressed, swore and wept my weary way through my first handmade dress. The finished product turned out a little crooked in places, pinched in others, but I'd never been quite so delightedly relieved. That relief lasted until I raced through taking up the hem and crunched over a forgotten pin in my haste. The needle bent. I heard myself sigh through gritted teeth. 



"Nickel and Dimed, Undercover in Low-wage USA" by Barbara Ehrenreich

Journalist Barbara Ehrenreich decided in 2002 to experience for herself "the other America" where people work long hours for minimum income.

She went serving in Florida, scrubbing in Maine and selling in Minnesota.

She found that society depended for basic but essential services such as cleaning houses and offices, waitressing, etc on paying wages that the workers cannot live on.

She found that the less people are paid the more anxious employers are to monitor them each second and to squeeze every bead of sweat out of their labour.

In most places that she worked she had to take on a second job just to survive, as did most of her co-workers and working two jobs put enormous pressure on their bodies.

She found it very difficult to find affordable accommodation. In three states she found that housing was depressing, unsafe, dirty and absurdly over priced. She often had to reside in a cheap motel or a trailer park.

The application for jobs process seemed designed to intimidate or over awe the applicant, especially the mandatory drug testing.

She found that the routine jobs she did de-humanized her and she asked "If you hump away at menial jobs 360 days per year, does some kind of repetitive injury of the spirit set in?"

There were limitations to her research because she knew and the reader knew that she was just visiting and could pull out at any time, but the observations in her book let the reader know that there is widespread poverty amongst the American Dream.

We enjoyed reading the book and it generated a lively discussion about many topics including minimum wages and unions, social welfare and employers.

The book for discussion in August is "Tell Me I'm here" by Anne Deveson. The blurb tells that it is a moving and courageous story of a family's experience with schizophrenia. New members are welcome to join the bookclub to discuss a different book each month.




