On Thursday 14th May, Mary was one of 97 recipients of Australian Awards, which included Public Service awards. Police Medals, Service Medals for Distinguished Fire Service, Ambulance Service Medal, Emergency Services, Conspicuous Service Medals for members of Armed Services and a Commendation for Gallantry for a soldier in action in Afghanistan. The majority of the awards were Order of Australia Awards, and it was inspiring to hear of the various fields of community service undertaken by so many Victorians, from medical research, conservation and the environment, contributions to the arts, and the betterment of disadvantaged people such as through foster care, people working with people with disabilities, minority ethnic groups, promotion of religious tolerance, and much more! Before the presentation of the awards by the Governor of Victoria, the Hon. Alex Chernov, AO, QC, in the splendid Ballroom at Government House, the many guests were entertained by the Melbourne High School Band. At the conclusion of the ceremony the Governor mingled with the guests who were able to wander into the other reception areas and share in refreshments.

Australian Honours and Awards presented included the highest, Officer in the General Division (**OA**,) next the Member of the General Division, (**AM**) and the Medal of the Order of Australia in the General Division (**OAM**). **Mary** was one of the 12 recipients of the AM. Most people in Meredith will be aware of her advocacy for young people in Nursing Homes, and for her success in having the State and Federal Governments finally

The Pearly (Grey) Gates

There are new gates at the Morrison Cemetery designed, built and painted by John Parkinson. The Cemetery Trust received a grant of \$3000 from the Department of Health to renew the gates.

They replace gates made by Jim Cole of Meredith Engineering in the early 1970's and required removal of two huge pine trees.

John initially intended to just make a pair of gates to replace the dilapidated old ones but after looking at gates everywhere, creating many different designs and considering suitable materials and cost he built two grand but elegant, heavy duty gates and side panels.

These are attached to posts that he made and concreted six

It's History

Michael Pollard lodged a complaint against Isabella Ross, the holder for 12 months of 240 acres of land under the 19th section in the parish of Coolebarghurk, near Meredith. He said that she had never lived on the land, in fact had never seen it. The only dwelling place was a hut without a fireplace, and the other improvements consisted of a small amount of fencing. These improvements were not effected by Isabella Ross, but by Alexander Ross, her brother-in-law, whose cattle ran upon the land. Pollard said he met Miss Ross at Lethbridge railway station, and asked permission to run cattle on the selection, when she told him that it belonged to Alexander Ross, who selected in her name and then turned her out of doors. Some more Rosses were the holders of a square mile of land, and they were all dummies for Alexander Ross, who was a land jobber. He (Pollard) had no animus against Ross, nor did he wish to select, but "he did not like to see the whole stretch of country between Lethbridge and Meredith lying uncultivated." 
The players (and all the adults) were very excited by the win as they hadn't defeated Anakie in quite a while.

Keith b. 23/6/1938 was the son of Archie and Lila Hearn and brother to Ian, Margaret, Ron and Daryl. The Hearn family lived on the farm down the Midland Highway and he walked to the State School.

When he left school he worked on Gargan's farm doing general farm work and learnt to shear.

He had his own semi-trailer and carted wool and super (in bags in those days) and worked spreading super with his brother Ian. After Ian had his stroke, Keith's brother-inlaw Paddy Scanlon took over the business and Keith continued to work with him in the season.

In the off season, Keith did quite a few different jobs, working at Jacksons and Herds Abattoirs in Geelong and carting sheep for live export to Portland. John Nolan told that he carted the hardwood timber for John and Mary's new house at Cargerie in 1964.

He met Dorothy Scanlon at the local in 1959 A wedding photo of "Tojo" and Dot. and they were married in 1961. They courted in the truck.

Locals tell that they'd drive to Ballarat for fish and chips in the truck, to Geelong to a dance in the truck. Keith drove to

Gisborne to visit Dot and she had to drive the truck home after he'd had a few drinks.

He was a quiet loved a drink or he'd had a few drinks.

They had a family of Darryn, Leanne, Debra, Craig (dec) and Susan

Everyone called Keith "Tojo", a nickname he picked up when he had his hair cut rather short one day as a child. An Uncle of his who had been to WWII came around the corner, saw him and called him Tojo because the cut resembled that of the

> Japanese Emperor Tojo. Ron couldn't get home to Meredith quick enough to tell his friends and the name stuck!

In the early 2000's Keith fenced with his brother Ron. He supplied wood around town and even helped Dot with the country mail runs.

In the last few years when he couldn't drive, Dot would take him to Melbourne with her on her runs for Camerons. In the last years Dot looked after and nursed Keith and did a wonderful job to keep him at home where he was happiest.

He died in Geelong on May 4,. A service was held at Meredith Cemetery on Tuesday, May 10. A huge crowd of friends and family attended and

afterwards swapped stories over a cup of tea.

He was a quiet man and a great listener, had a lot of friends, loved a drink or two and knew the district better than most of us.

He was also a lovable larrikin!

feet into the ground with stones at the base. He found engineering works either couldn't curve the steel or were cost prohibitive. So he made adaptations to his pipe bender and bent them himself!

The lids for the posts consist of 13 parts, the gates close with a magnetic catch and the hinges are made out of 1 inch ball bearings for easy swinging.


John tells that there are more Parkinson's interred in the Cemetery than any other family so it is apt that he became the creator of the Pearly Grey Gates.



communicating with each other so that some funds were provided to build four special houses to accommodate up to 10 young people in each. Unfortunately there have been problems with the one into which Christopher was planned to move, as he would lose the funding for his therapy, and provision of a carer necessary for him to be able to go out with his friends, go to hydro therapy and to come home. So there is still work to be done! However there is no doubt that the work which Mary has done on behalf of this very disadvantaged group has raised awareness of the problem and has improved conditions for

Although Mary's AM was "For service to people with acquired Brain Injuries, particularly as an advocate for age appropriate accommodation" she has had a long involvement with community service. She was one of the founding movers for the Meredith Kindergarten, Cubs and Scouts in Meredith and coached a local junior netball team for 4 years. Always interested in education, she was involved with St. Joseph's Primary school and later with Woodburn Creek Primary school for many years, where she not only taught Religious Education but was a member of the Woodburn Creek Tennis team. In Ballarat she was a member of the first Sacred Heart College Development Council and after doing a course with the Ballarat Regional Alcohol and Drug Dependency Association, worked as a Drug and Alcohol counselor at a drop In Centre in Ballarat.

In 1983 Mary became involved with Christian Life Community a world wide Christian Community.

She was involved at a State Level, became National President and was eventually elected to the World Executive - the first Australian to do so - and in 1998 became World Vice president. Her advocacy for young people in nursing homes began when Christopher was discharged from hospital after 6 months. She was instrumental in founding the Young People in Nursing Homes (YPNH) Consortium and 2001 Inability / Possibility specifically for young people with Acquired Brain Injury.

Of course her other big contribution with Chris and John has been the Meredith Music Festival on their property. It combines their love of music and the land and their great hospitality to people of all ages, especially young people, and also provides a source of funding to local organizations in the district which they love.

Brian and Elaine moved to a new unit in Bannockburn in 2010 and are kept busy catching up with all the Meredith people living in Bannockburn.




50 Years Married



Alvie Wiseman celebrates 90 years

Alvie grew up in Geelong and worked at the Grammar School. She married Bill Wiseman from Meredith in 1946 and they lived at 8 Sutherland Street.

Bill's father, Sam, who had a trucking business in Meredith, gave them a blue Ford truck. They grew onions and peas, carted wood, wool, sheep, cattle etc, carted and spread super phosphate, had a fuel depot for B.P. and delivered it to farmers.

Alvie bought her first Fowlers bottling outfit from money she made picking bags of peas. She would pick 5 or 6 bags per day and receive 50 pence per bag.

Bill was diagnosed with arthritis in 1953. He tried to drive and be actively involved in the business but as time went on, it got more difficult for him. They employed several drivers and during this time Alvie organized the work, the drivers, the trucks, the business, the phone calls, the book work, looked after Bill with his doctors, diets, pills, bets and clothes and their children, Geoff, Ross and Rhonda.

Jeff Cooper bought the business in 1967 and Alvie continued to organize the business. Jeff became part of the family.

Alvie was famous in Meredith for milking her cows. She milked, separated, made butter and baked for her family, friends and the many organizations she belonged to.

In her small kitchen she was always coaxing the fire in the wood stove to go with a few sticks or pine cones, the kettle was always on the stove, scraps were boiling for the chooks, butter was being made, an apple slice just out of the oven would be on the bench, a ginger fluff sponge being prepared on the kitchen table for someone's birthday, flour being ground for bread making, fruit on the floor for bottling, scones always freshly baked for guests and a breakfast concoction being served to Bill at any time of the day.

Alvie lived in her small house with her chooks, cats and cows and continued to be busy until she sold out and moved to Geelong in 2003 where she continues to cook, knit, tend her garden and look after her family and everyone else.



She returns to Bangalow, a heritage village in the hinterland behind Byron Bay where her parents were married. She admits that she is mesmerized by her family drama and obsessed with the past!
