

EXHIBITION OF THE REVISED MEREDITH STRUCTURE PLAN



Golden Plains Shire Council has prepared amendment C57 to the Planning Scheme. The amendment proposes to make changes to the Local Planning Policy Framework of the Golden Plains Planning Scheme by replacing the Meredith Structure Plan and inserting a precinct plan for Meredith in Clause 21.03 and referencing the Meredith Structure Plan document in Clause 21.04. The amendment will also rezone land as identified in the Structure Plan.

The Meredith Structure Plan document is available for viewing on the Golden Plains Shire website www.goldenplains.vic.gov.au. An explanatory report and other documents which support the amendment may be inspected at the following locations:

Any person who may be affected by the amendment may make a submission to the planning authority.

Vale to Douglas Lloyd Henderson

Doug Henderson passed away peacefully on March 29 at Bannockburn Aged Care and was interred in Ballarat Cemetery after a Family Service.

Doug was a devoted husband to Maureen for 68 years and father of Helen, Donald {dec}, Allan {Dooz}, and Lorraine {Pip}.

He had 10 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.

Doug had recently celebrated 2 family occasions; Maureen's 90th birthday on March 9th and Grandparents Day at Bannockburn Aged Care, when 15 of his family visited him.

Doug was born and lived in Bamganie, went to school at Bamganie State School where he obtained his Merit Certificate and left school in May 1933 and the school closed!

He caught rabbits, cut wood and did fencing for farmers. He sometimes cut the posts from the trees, dug the holes for the post with a shovel, bored holes in the posts with a brace and bit and pulled the wires through and secured them in place.

After WW11 he erected 8¼ miles of fencing for Sir Henry Bolte at "Kialla". He also erected a lot of fences at "Narmbool" and helped to build the tennis court there.

He spent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years in the Army. He enlisted in the 4^{th} Light Horse. He told that he went everywhere, he never had a horse, never got on a horse and later the Division was called the 4^{th} Motor Division. He spent the last 12 months on Thursday Island.

When he returned to Meredith he went cutting "bloody wood"

again, still with the axe!

Doug worked on the Bannockburn Council maintenance truck for 25 years repairing roads, bridges etc.

At weekends he worked, fencing for farmers, on his own farm or in his vegetable garden.



Doug told that his hobby was work!

Maureen tells that he was organized and always had a job planned and that he had many skills.

He was a member of Meredith Fire Brigade for 54 years.

He served 14 years on Meredith School Committee and organized

the Austin Cup School Sports on Meredith Oval on a number of occasions.

He was President of Meredith Landcare for 4 years and was a very active member.

He was Treasurer of Meredith Senior Citizens for 9 years and on the Meredith Hall Committee for 10 years.


Doug and Maureen moved to Bannockburn in July 2003 after living for 62 years at 27 Wallace Street, Meredith.

MHIG visited Nash's Quarry at Lethbridge on April 7 to see and learn about the quarry that supplied ballast for the construction of the Geelong to Ballarat Railway Line and supplied the bluestone for the Railway Stations and many local and other buildings. Thanks to Colin O'Connor for the tour and to Raymond Kelly for organizing the event.

Don Van Beusichem arrived in Sydney on May 6, 1951 after his Auntie had paid the fare.

He had decided that there was no future for him in Holland and decided to immigrate to Canada. The Immigration Department offered him a vacancy on a plane to Australia on a Friday however, and he left Holland the following Sunday.

Don tells that there were thousands leaving Holland at that time.

He had met two Dutch girls on the aeroplane who were coming to Australia to be with their Dutch fiancées at Lilydale and they invited him to come to Lilydale with them.

Don could speak English which was one of the four languages he learnt at school. The girls had little English language so thought Don would be a help to them.

Don and Coral were married on March 7, 1959 and have lived at 35 Wallace Street, Meredith for 52 years. Their family comprises David, Lynette, Lois and Peter who died at 11 months from a congenital heart defect.

Don was Meredith's handy man. He was willing to work at

weekends and was talented at building, fixing, demolishing and reusing.

Don and Coral have always had an extensive flower and vegetable garden and extensive knowledge, experience and expertise of propagation and plants.

Don's passion now is collecting old shearing shed gear. He attends clearing sales, buys, cleans, restores and displays and in recent years has visited some famous outback shearing sheds in NSW.

Something you may not know about Don is that he was a self taught pianist who played by ear. When he first came to Meredith and boarded at the Royal Hotel, he played for sing songs and dances. Bob McArthur and Don played the piano, sometimes together, and two Soldier Settler surveyors played violin and accordion.

Their favourite song was "You'll never go to Heaven in an old Ford car cos an old Ford car won't go that far".

having the chance to learn more about the efforts of the men and women who served in all the various wars.

James: There were lots of other ideas that kept on being brought up and these included baking ANZAC biscuits to remember what the families of the soldiers were going through when their husbands, sons, daughters and friends went off to fight. One of the boys in grade 5 though came up with a very simple but excellent way to keep this spirit going.

Hattie: His idea was that every time he was faced with something that scared him he was going to try harder to overcome this fear or situation just like those people did when they were confronted with frightening situations when they were serving our country.

James: These are all simple ways in which we can keep the ANZAC legend alive and continue to appreciate the way we live now.

Hattie: Once again I am really proud to take part in this service and I would like to think that one day that I can bring my own children along to take to part in it..







Ingredients:

Whole shoulder of lamb, seasoned

1 onion, sliced 3 cloves garlic, crushed Juice of 1 lemon 2 tsp dried oregano

2 tbl olive oil 300ml red wine

1 cup puy lentils 100g sun-dried tomatoes

Bunch of fresh mint, chopped

Method:

Pre-heat oven to 220c. Scatter onions over large casserole dish, place lamb on top. Sprinkle with garlic, oregano, juice, oil and wine.

Season with salt and pepper.

Cover tightly with foil place the lid on top. Place dish in oven for 2 mins, reduce heat to 170c and cook for a further 3 hours, removing foil after 2 ½ hours.

Meanwhile cook lentils in 1 litre of cold water. Simmer for 15 mins until just tender, drain well. Mix lentils, mint and tomatoes into juice around meat. Replace foil and cook for a further 20 mins.

Transfer lamb to large serving plate and pull apart with fork and spoon, serve with lentil mixture around meat.

*Tip: Serve lamb with crusty French bread and steamed greens, baby spinach or cavalo nero with olive oil and balsamic vinegar.

Girl vs. Wild

I thought I'd misheard my friend Elyse when she told me what she wanted to do on our one precious week of uni holidays.

'Camping?' I repeated, baffled. My phone reception must have been very bad. 'Camping? In a tent, you mean? Outside?'

Once Elyse had repeated her idea, and I had remembered camping usually did involve being in a tent outside, I opened my mouth to say I couldn't possibly go camping, I was much too busy for that. But something stopped me. What was I really busy with? Sure, I was simultaneously stirring dinner, typing a rather uninspired essay, checking facebook, chatting on the phone and watching some ridiculous show about people with terribly untidy houses. As much as I like little luxuries like a roof over my head, indoor plumbing and a comfortable bed, it was time for a break from being permanently attached to my phone and computer. That's how I ended up bouncing down a rutted track in an old panel van in a bush paddock near Meredith.

The first challenge our intrepid band of campers faced was getting our site set up in the two minutes we had before the sun disappeared. occasions, lost all the pegs, forgot the fly and realised the suspicious lump under the pegged out tent floor is the roll of duct tape I'll need to keep the roof on. If 'The 30 second tent!' was left to me, there was a fair chance it'd be all set up about three minutes before it was time to pack up and go home in the morning. Luckily one of my fellow campers was a former boy scout, so I left it to the experts and went to gather firewood as the sun set.

As I dragged half a tree back up the hill in the fading light, listening to birds calling sleepily and mozzies humming, I was struck by how beautiful the country is around Meredith, especially at this time of year. When I lived at home I took it for granted, and these days I always seem to be driving through on my way somewhere else. I don't take a lot of time to breathe the crisp chilly air or lie on the cold hard ground and look up at the sky. On our little trip I realised how much I miss out on in the bustle of Melbourne and the suburbs of Ballarat, where buildings crowd in on all sides and it's never quite dark enough to see the stars.

I came home covered in dirt, with my clothes and hair reeking of campfire smoke and my back aching from sleeping on rocks in a crowded tent. Geelong & Ballarat Railway Line

Part of report by "Our Special Reporter" in Argus Newspaper 23/4/1861

"The next site on which a station is to be erected is Lethbridge, a locality erstwhile known as Muddy Water Holes, but in which the decencies of life are now too rife for the preservation of so uncouth a designation. A few months since, more than a thousand masons and stone-breakers actively plied their vocation on this spot; but those times have passed away.

In place of stonebreakers are six machines, erected on a staging, with shoots and hoppers beneath which, plying ceaselessly all day long, supply the needful bluestone metal.

The machines which require only the superintendence of the feeders will break from four to five cubic yards per hour.

At Stony Rises, a depot about 20 miles further down the line, the stone breaking-machines break as many as six cubic yards per hour; but this apparent superiority is only the result of greater softness in the spalls.

The number of men still employed at Lethbridge working under Mr Irons, the manager, is about 400, not more than 60 of whom are masons; for the stone required for the viaduct is nearly all ready."

The Geelong to Ballarat Railway Line was opened in April 1862. A meeting to organize celebrations of 150 years of the railway line will be held at the Meredith Community House on May 2 at 7 pm. 





"Cows, Pigs, Wars and Witches" by Marvin Harris.

Marvin Harris answers some perplexing questions about human behaviour and reveals that the reasons always stem from identifiable and intelligible sources.

He suggest a solution to why the Hindu treats his cow as sacred, why the Jew will not eat pork, why societies enter into wars and why an estimated 500,000 people were convicted of witchcraft and burned to death in Europe between the 15th and 17th centuries etc.

For example: he thinks that the Bible and the Koran condemned the pig because pig farming was a threat to the integrity of the basic culture and natural ecosystems of the Middle East.

He informs the reader that the causes for apparently irrational and inexplicable lifestyles is not understood by the people involved.

They will give an answer if questioned but he asks us to dismiss those answers and look at the results of their behaviour and work back from the results to discuss reasons for the behaviour and eventually to identify a

He challenges the reader to use this method to solve riddles of our own time.

There is also much valuable and interesting information in this book eg. India's cattle annually excrete 700 million tons of recoverable manure.

"He has chosen a number of bizarre and controversial cases that seem like insoluble riddles, linked them and taken us on an engaging adventure in sociological and anthological understanding."

The adventure was often complex and it was difficult to absorb all his reasoning.

The book for discussion in May is "Roundabout at Bangalow" by Shirley Walker.
