Out Bamganie way there is a glimpse of the past that can be seen on most weekends. Wally Tabone is an avid collector of all things old, especially horse harness, collars and horse paraphernalia. He has kept horses on his property and regularly rides them up the road.

But recently Wally expressed his wish to own a harness

horse and asked me where he could buy a good one. I gave him some contacts and some weeks later a 3 year old Clydesdale cross horse arrived at the farm and Wally called him Billy.

Over the next few weeks Wally broke him to saddle and then he started to train him for harness. Billy was regaled in harness gear and Wally walked behind him, round and round the paddock and then up and down the road. Billy took to harness like a duck to water, showing great intelligence and was soon was deemed ready to be harnessed to a cart.

Wally brought a "horse break" from Melbourne. This is a heavy cart with long shafts and designed especially for training horses to harness.

But I recognized that this cart was special!

Looking over it, I recognized that this was the very horse break owned by legendary horse breaker Eric Lawrence of

Footscray, Melbourne. He was regularly seen in and around the streets of Footscray and Kensington working his horses. I remember seeing him with this canary yellow horse break with five horses in Footscray Road when I was a teenager.

The day arrived for Billy to be harnessed to the horse break for the first time and I gave Wally a hand. Billy went in without a fault and Wally worked him around the paddock.

After a couple of weeks Wally declared that Billy was ready for the road.

Wally invited me to come along. Lucky me!

Billy worked brilliantly. After 16 thrilling kilometres we arrived back.

Wally who is a brilliant tradesman has built his own cart and he is now working Billy in it. I'm sure that Billy will give Wally years of pleasure.

Linda and I are hoping for a ride in the new cart and just maybe a ride in the old horse break before it goes back to Melbourne.

Thanks for the memories Wally!

Pathway Extended

The Police Paddocks pathway has had two further extensions in recent weeks. The main circuit path has a new off-take which runs from the 'viewing circle' on the valley edge, for about 200 m. along the creek's western boundary to the northern end of the Paddocks. Although a dead-end at the present, this short spur opens up more views of the creek valley up to the reserve's northern boundary.

The second extension is another short section which joins the loop path and Nuttall Street. This gives townspeople more convenient pedestrian access to the site. (Drivers should still park at the main entrance on Campion Road at the southern end, near the wool store.)



You might have heard about the *Save and Raise* campaign that is operating in regional Victoria at the moment. Sponsored by a number of bodies, it offers two layers of free home consultation. One, simply offers to replace all incandescent globes with low energy bulbs and, if you want it, other energy saving devices and low water use shower heads. All free of charge or any obligation! A second service is an energy audit which really involves simply sitting down with the consultant and answering a series of questions related to energy use. Again, it's a freebie.

We undertook both services recently and are glad we did. Not only did we end up with some nifty devices that power down appliances on "standby", which will knock a few dollars off our ever increasing power bill, but also picked up some good advice on how to simply lower energy costs.

POLICE NEWS FROM MEREDITH.

I would like to open this months report by thanking the many people who I have heard from expressing interest in re starting the Blue Light Disco's. The response has been positive and my aim to push towards kicking of the first of them in the new year.

Over recent weeks there has been an increase in thefts occurring on rural properties within our area. A Barwon Water facility located on Durdidwarrah Road, Durdidwarrah had two large stainless steel screens stolen. These items are unique and were custom built for a specific application. From a rural property located in Perdrisat Road, Lethbridge offenders have stolen 15 Metal Corp brand Stud Master stock pens and a Electric Fence unit. The stock pens were in particularly good condition and were 63 mm diameter metal galvanised. Offenders used a vehicle to access the property after cutting a pad lock.

It would appear that offences are being committed late in the evening and it is likely that these thefts are related. I urge all property owners to be aware of the location of their plant and farm equipment and to do their best to keep their property secure. I would also urge landholders to take the time to stamp or etch there Victorian drivers licence numbers into items where possible. This makes the process of identifying stolen property at later times a much easier process.

I ask all residents in rural areas to be vigilant in relation to suspicious vehicles or persons and where possible to record registration details of cars which may assist in solving crime within the area. I encourage any person with information to contact me.

Round 1 for the Firsts and Seconds is against Bannockburn on October 8 (2nds at home) with the thirds to be announced. These were two very competitive fixtures last year and the Rams will be looking to post a couple of wins to kick off the season and start the run to the finals from round one.




As it is the end of the season we have farewelled some of our

Jim Duggan

Jim Duggan celebrated his 75th birthday on August 28 with a lunch at the Bannockburn Hotel with a number of his friends. He thoroughly enjoyed the party and the sponge birthday cake filled with layers of berries and cream made for him, as a surprise by Dawn Sergent.

Jim lived with his family on Duggan's Road and went to school at She Oaks until he was 12 years old. He rode his push bike for 3½ miles to get to school over rough gravel roads and sandy bush tracks and sometimes he'd get tangled up in the thick sand and down he'd go!

He often rode with Max Cooper and Evelyn and Ron Wiseman who lived nearby. Kath Randall was the teacher at She Oaks and he tells that he enjoyed his time there and that she was a great teacher.

When he was about 10 years old an Auntie gave him a nice little dog that he called "Sparks". The dog managed to get away, ran fast down the paddock and caught a rabbit. This started Jim's rabbiting hobby and he has always owned a dog since then! His Uncle, Fab Duggan sold the farm in 1948 and the family moved to Meredith. Jim went to Meredith State School for 2 years and then left to cut wood. He tells that he didn't even get to leave school when he was handed an axe! He believes that he was in the last generation to be handed axes! The next generation were wiser, as thee was no future in cutting wood. There was nothing easy about it.

Jim and his friends Don Sellars and George Shell often went

rabbiting and fishing around Meredith.

Jim tells that they have been good mates all their lives. They'd head out of town to "Borhoneyghurk", to Geoff Elliotts on the Mt Mercer Road or down Taylors Road on their bikes, after school and at weekends with their dogs following and a mattock tied on the bike.

Jim said that there were oodles of rabbits and they'd often come home with 40 or more. They'd skin the rabbits, put the skins on wires, dry them and later sell the skins. Buyers from Geelong travelled the country districts buying rabbit skins and at one time they paid 10/- per skin. The boys would catch 20-30 rabbits in Meredith when the Coolebarghurk Creek flooded, which it did nearly every year. The rabbits that lived along the creek under the furze bushes would get flooded out and head up to the furze bushes on the vacant block of land over the Midland Highway. Jim often went rabbiting or fishing with Mrs Moran. She loved to walk to Nuttalls to go fishing.

Jim didn't play sport and tells that his life was work and often heavy work: everything added up to work!

He worked at the waterworks for the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust {later called Barwon Water} for 28 years.

Even when he worked at the waterworks all week, Jim cut wood on weekends and holidays.

Jim retired in 1989 and has worked with wood in his workshop creating many pieces of furniture and children's toys.



It's History

The company previously owning the property became insolvent some two years ago, since when the plant has been idle. Active operations will be resumed next month.

Great Grandmother on the First Train

Marg Cooper

Miss Victoria Charlotte Steddy b. 26/9/1855 was the daughter of a pioneering family who came out from Kent in 1856. Her father had the first butcher shop in Lethbridge on the corner of Midland Highway and Russell Street. She married Thomas Spiller at Lethbridge on 28/4/1877 and they had a family of 6 sons and 1 daughter, Emma.

They lived on a property they called "Glenmoor" in the Moorabool Valley in the Bannockburn district. Family history tells that Victoria Steddy travelled on the official train carrying the Governor on April 10, 1862, the day the line was open.

Howard Donaldson, of "Riversglen", Lethbridge is a great grandson of Victoria Charlotte Spiller {Steddy} and he would like to travel on the re-enactment train in April 1912 with his son Darren and his 2 year old grandson Kirby Zac.

On April 10, 1862 the railway Line between Geelong and Ballarat was opened. "After formalities and a breakfast in Geelong a train of 13 carriages containing 500 persons, 400 from Melbourne and 100 from Geelong and Ballarat, left for Ballarat. Some natural fears may have been felt as the viaduct was passed over, but they soon disappeared when the people found out how steadily the tremendous weight was borne, and gave way to admiration at the scene around and beneath them. Everyone knows that the scenery generally about this part of the country is tame enough, and there was little to occupy the attention till the bare plains gave way to frequent trees as the train neared Meredith. Then began the interest of the trip." From The Argus Friday April 11, 1862.

More formalities were held in Ballarat in the afternoon and evening after the train from Geelong arrived.

Many of the passengers could remember that not ten years ago almost the whole land over which that train travelled was wilderness, unmarked by roads, untraversed by telegraphs, and undreamt of for railways. The journey of a couple of hours now was the labour of days then, the rains and winds of winter were almost conquering enemies, and the summer itself was scarcely more endurable. But the gold of Ballarat was discovered, a current of ardent and persevering adventurers set in to that forward field, hope and industry struggled long against the natural difficulties of the ground, and at last the gold miner found his reward.

On March 29, 1862 the final linking of the railway occurred. On April 8-9, 1862 special trains ran conveying staff in

readiness for opening day.

On April 10, 1862 the line was formally opened by Governor Sir Henry Barkly. On opening day the double track was extended from West Geelong to Lethbridge.

On July 14, 1862 the double track was completed to Meredith. From The Heritage of Lethbridge by Eric McGillivray.

Events being held include: 5 man fog step up, drafting, running edge, entrapment, mapping, radio communications, hydrants and extinguishers. The teams of Juniors must demonstrate their knowledge of all procedures and how to operate the equipment as well as their ability to work co-operatively and effectively in their team. Elaine Junior Leader Sam Lewis says "in time these kids may choose to continue their training and join the CFA as Seniors but for now the focus is really on having fun. It's a great way for kids to learn skills and build self confidence and be part of important part of the community organization".

The general public and especially any kids interested in joining the CFA Junior Brigade are very welcome to attend the event and see what the Cup and the Juniors are all about.



The No 1 Ladies' Detective Agency by Alexander McCall Smith.

Alexander McCall Smith has been a professor of medical law at Edinburgh University. He was born in what is now known as Zimbabwe. He helped set up Botswana's first University Law School and taught there. In the 1970's and 1980's he published academic texts on law and medical ethics and wrote a series of children's books.

In 1996 he received awards and global recognition for The No 1 Ladies' Detective Agency and since then has concentrated on writing fiction. Among his other achievements he helped to set up Botswana's first centre for opera training, the No 1 Ladies' Opera House.

He now lives in Edinburgh.

In this book he has written about Precious Ramotswe who inherited some cows from her father. She is described as having a voluminous girth of traditional African femininity, of being a modern woman and a genuinely independent thinker. She sells the cows and starts her own business as a detective. She rents a room, hires a Secretary, buys some pens and paper and waits for business. She solves many cases with her shrewd and sharp thinking, her understanding of human behaviour, her common sense and her wide network of contacts.

Weaving through the narrative are her reflections on her life and her father's kindness, on changes going on as her country moves into modern times, on the struggle to retain the good parts of Botswanan culture and customs and on her strong love of Africa and her fellow Africans.

One reason the book is such a delight is that modern Africa is presented, through Ramotswe, with tenderness, wit and acceptance, rather than with fear, violence and hate. The book portrays a positive picture of life in Africa.

Alexander McCall Smith writes in a deceptively plain, clear and precise style. His narrative was acclaimed as being fresh, individual and delightful. He has written a number of books about Precious and her Detective Agency including "The Kalahari Typing School for Men."

After reading "The No 1 Ladies Detective Agency", some bookclub members have read many of the other books in the series

The book for discussion in October is "The Year of the Flood" by Margaret Attwood.


