Country Families Deserve a Break

Occasional Day Care operates at the Meredith Community Centre on Wednesday and Friday mornings during school term. Last year the Federal government terminated its "Take a Break" program which part funded the service, and this year State Government funding has also been terminated, leaving the program without support from

either government.

This will mean that local Childcare services in our region will be forced to triple the fees charged in order to remain open or make the difficult decision to close their doors.

"Take a Break" funding has provided children in our community the opportunity to have social interaction with other children as well as be part of a learning development program that continues as they progress through their school years.

This program also provides parents and carers of the children the chance to have some time to attend to appointments, volunteer within the community, assist with the family business and have time to attend other courses or do further study. With many families not having extended family around, it is important those living in the country have the same opportunity to access a service such as

childcare in their own communities as those living



Leading Senior Constable Greg Kitchen

Over the past eight weeks since taking up the post at Meredith, I am delighted to report that crime has been minimal. A rural theft from a house that has occurred on Mt Mercer Road had been solved and three young offenders have been charged and await court in Ballarat.

Over recent weeks, there has been isolated instances of graffiti bought to my attention and I would encourage anyone with information or knowledge of the person or persons involved to either give me a call at the police station or to leave a note under the front door of the police station if I am not on duty. Even anonymous information can assist me in dealing with the problem. Meredith is a beautiful town and graffiti is something that we can all certainly do without.

Since starting at Meredith, I have had preliminary conversations with Leading Senior Constable DEN HARTOG at the Inverleigh Police Station in relation to getting the blue light discos up and running. I would encourage any parent with young children to get in contact with me at the police station so that I can gauge support within the town.

Last year the metropolitan road toll decreased by 15% but deaths on country roads increased by 13%. The major contributing factors to regional road trauma are speed, fatigue, distraction (in the form of mobile telephones, alcohol and drugs) and the failure to wear seatbelts. I would like to take this opportunity to urge drivers to really take note of these statistics. All too often innocent people are involved in accidents resulting from driver behaviour that would fit one or more of these categories.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of those people that have attended at the police station and welcomed me to the area. The support that I have received has been truly overwhelming and appreciated.







What a send off! The Meredith Hall was full of friends and family for a simple but sincere service where members of his family and friends paid tribute to him. The crowd then lined Staughton Street to salute Ron with a stubby of beer in their hands as he left Meredith for the last time. They lingered in groups standing in the sun and swapped tales of Ron's adventures and exploits and then moved into the hall for afternoon tea and more stories. The wake lasted into the night.

Ron was born in 1933 to Lila and Archie Hearn and is brother to Ian, Margaret, Keith and Daryl. The family lived on their farm on the Midland Highway, just south of Meredith. After 8th Grade Ron refused to go to school, so his father bought him an axe and sent him out the bush to cut wood.

In 1956 he went to Mildura area shearing for contractor Percy Musgrove of Sunraysia Shearing Co. He loved the life; working hard, spot lighting, fishing, shooting {never seen game like it} and having an odd drink!

Margaret grew up in Merbein and wanted to meet a tall, dark, handsome man with a car so she didn't have to walk to sport and social events. She met Ron and he took her home from the Saturday night dance in his tan Volkswagon with a yellow stripe. It was well known to police in the Mildura area and that it could climb hills where police cars could not go!

Ron and Margaret were married in 1959 and after a year working around Meredith he went back shearing on the Darling and West Darling Rivers. He was away shearing for almost 14 years. He gave Margaret a choice of where to live: with his father, in a caravan or to buy an old house in Meredith. Margaret chose the old house. That house burnt down in 1972 and in 1974 they built a new brick house for their family of Anne, Brian and twins, Lorraine and Russell.

On 14/2/2009 Ron celebrated 20 years since he was first diagnosed with bowel cancer. He faced many health problems in that time but continued to run sheep on his farm on the Midland Highway, to rear pigs and to work fencing around the district, often with the help of his brother Tojo. Ron was a strong man who relished hard work and hard play.

His family told that he didn't show emotion outwardly but that he had a heart of gold.


Ron was known as Rammy!

Thomas Kent was born at Nerrina {Ballarat} on June 17, 1923, the son of school teacher, Thomas Isadore Kent and local girl Ada {nee Lugg}.

His early life as son of a school teacher was spent in different locations around Victoria and he therefore attended many different schools. {One of his earlier recollections is of attending Dana St School in Ballarat and of its then Principal Mr Spielvogel.} Because his father's name was also Thomas he was known by family and friends as "Jack".

When the family moved to Essendon, he attended Essendon High School to complete his Leaving Certificate, and then to Melbourne High to complete Leaving Honours.

His first job after school was at Angus & Robertson, and then the bank of Australasia.

He entered Army Service in December 1941 and was involved in the early development and implementation of radar, reaching the rank of Staff Sergeant.

After the war he attended Teachers College where he met and married his first wife Betty Evans.

They had three sons, Robert, David and Paul.

During this time he attained his Bachelor of Arts at Melbourne University.

Jack and Betty were divorced in 1960 and in 1967 he married Judy Bruce and they had two daughters, Sally and Margaret.

Living in Essendon, they also had a weekend farm at Snake Valley.

After a battle with cancer Judy died in 1983.

During his teaching career Jack taught at many schools including Williamstown, Kingsville, Footscray, Avondale Heights, North Essendon, FawknerNorth, Glenroy and Brunswick.

At some of these he was Special Grade Principal.

Towards the end of his career he was involved in Teacher Training and mentoring.

Jack and his daughters moved to Meredith to be near his son Robert and his family in 1987 and on a trip to China in 1988 he met and later married Lorraine Honeyman.

Jack and Lorrie were involved in the Meredith Community in particular, the Anglican Church, the Landcare Group and the Meredith Masonic Lodge.

Jack had been a member of many Lodges, holding various posts over many years.

They farmed full time and Lorrie ran a small wool craft business.

In recent years they retired to Grovedale where they enjoyed a busy retirement in the company of other ex-Meredith residents at Church, Probus and Lodges.

Jack passed away in St John of God Hospital on July 27, 2011, after fighting leukaemia.



The Cavey House at Cargerie

I often visited my Grandma Cavey at her house at Cargerie, when I was a child. My mother Priscilla was the daughter of Edward and Emma Cavey {Linford}.

William Linford and his son-in-law Herbert Edward Large, who had married Elizabeth Linford in 1871, set up a store on approximately 4 acres of land owned by William Linford.

The store had 2 rooms across the front and a tack room on the back. It was near the site gazetted for the township of Cargerie, however this did not eventuate. The store known as "Linford and Large", originally sold dry goods, horse tack and mining equipment as it was on the route for those seeking their fortune on the goldfields.

By 1880 the gold rush was over and the store was converted to a house.

Family tell that the store and land were given to Emma Linford on her marriage to Edward Cavey in 1880 and was eventually known as Cavey's corner. My mother married John Edward Humphries and they lived at the Cavey house with Grandma and Uncle Emmett until they moved to Ballarat in 1927. Sadly their 4th child Leslie died of diphtheria before my birth and their 3rd child Myrtle died of diphtheria in Ward 5 at the Ballarat Hospital when my mother was giving birth to me.

the Meredith Sentinel Friday 5th November 1909.

A public meeting convened by the President of the Shire (Cr T. M Scott) will be held in the Shire Hall on Monday evening next, at 8 o'clock, to appoint two trustees to act on the Cemetery Trust in place of Messrs J. Bell and D. Grant, both deceased. A meeting was called some couple of months back, but the apathy of the residents was so great that only two turned up at the meeting.

We hope that a stern idea of duty will enter the breasts of the people, and that they will muster in strong force and appoint two gentlemen to act who will look after the upkeep of the Cemetery, which has hitherto enjoyed the reputation of not only being the last resting place of the human body, but the abode of snakes to such an extent that it was considered dangerous to travel through the undergrowth that was on and around the graves.

We feel sure that when the residents of the township fairly grasp the situation, more interest will be taken in public matters and instead of having to dig up "old bones" to fill a position it will be necessary to bring out ballot papers to return "live men" to look after the interests of the institutions of the district.


Council will continue its support for the well respected Golden Plains Community Planning Program by advertising the tender for the community planning facilitator role.





"Tell me I'm here" by Anne Deveson

Anne Deveson is/was a writer, broadcaster and documentary film-maker whose work on social justice issues has won widespread recognition.

When her eldest son Jonathon, developed schizophrenia at the age of seventeen she became a strong advocate in the field of mental illness. *Tell Me I'm Here* is an agonizingly honest record of her life as a valiantly struggling mother and a son with severe mental health problems.

She kept a diary so has written their story as a sequence of events. She has recorded the constant decline in the health of her son and the process of constant search for a cure. It follows from the first shock of discovery of the illness when he was 17 years old, to acceptance, to getting used to it as it got worse and worse.

She tells on the tendency to blame families, that physical illness is met with sympathy but mental illness is met with shame and that we have a culture that believes in the notion of cure and if we can't cure we embark on an odyssey of hope.

A large part of the story tells of her unsuccessful attempts to get help for her son.

Years ago mentally ill people were kept in asylums and

mental hospitals but it was decided that it is better for most mentally ill people to live in the community and receive care from health workers.

It seems that Jonathon could only get help if he requested it. When he was irrational and needed medical attention he was not capable of asking for help. He could not be admitted to hospitals against his will.

So Jonathon was arrested and jailed for petty crime, he lived on the street, was often violent, fearful and tormented. She states that jails are the biggest mental hospitals!

Throughout the 7 years of Jonathon's illness, Anne Deveson continues to work, to travel for her work and to look after her other children and to try and maintain a relationship with "the architect".


Jonathon died of a drug overdose when he was 24 years old.

She wrote to find her healing, for the families who also struggle to hold onto hope when often they are scourged by despair, to make us aware of the difficulties of the mentally ill and their families and to awaken us to the need for better action than we have.

Anne Deveson is a founder of SANE, the National Schizophrenia Organisation.
