Locals Speak Up on PTO Review

Ten locals and several officers from Golden Plains Shire and their consultants attended a consultation meeting in Meredith last month to gather input into the Shire's review of its Paths and Trails and Open Spaces Strategies. Among the issues discussed were

- Surface alternatives gravel, asphalt and concrete
- Need for access for people, disabilities/aged
- Entrances to paths need attention

Officers were questioned about the recently constructed

concrete footpath on the west side of Wallace Street, which appears to have happened without any community consultation or as part of any larger strategy.

The meeting offered suggestions for a *staged* walking/fitness track around Meredith

- Commencing at Meredith hall (good car parking)
- Tracks through Pioneer Park
- Creation of a 9 station fitness track in a cleared area of Pioneer Park
- Path continuing through back of recreation reserve and Council Depot, across highway, linking with walking tracks in Police Paddock, continuing along creek way of the Ibis and Middleton Walk (some private land at present), along creek, past school and

continuing to Creamery Road, across Highway to McLeod Street and to Hall.

The Police Paddock is seen as an important project for Meredith and its re-development is a long term project. Because of this, the walking track in the first instance may be located along Wallace Street to McLeod Street, and not crossing over to the Police Paddock.

Locals at the meeting also pointed to the need for a footpath along the east side of Wallace Street from Champ Street to school

CHANGES TO LOCAL TRAFFIC CONDITIONS

I am writing to notify you about the traffic management plan for Meredith Music Festival scheduled to occur on Friday 7 December – Sunday 9 December, 2012.

- The Meredith Music Festival traffic management plan has been approved by VICROADS. The summary of the plan is outlined here.
- School buses will undertake their normal route.
- We will implement one-way traffic on Mount Mercer Road from Bamganie Road to Cameron's Road from 4am on Friday 7 December to approximately 7pm. Traffic within the one-way zone travelling to Meredith will be diverted down Cameron's Road.
- We will implement a speed reduction to 40klm per hour on Thursday 6 December – Friday 7 December on Mount Mercer Road near Bamganie Road and on Mount Mercer Road immediately South and North of the festival site.
- We will implement a speed reduction to 40klm per hour from approximately 7pm on Friday 7 December to 7pm on Sunday 9 December on Mount Mercer Road near Bamganie Road and on Mount Mercer Road immediately South and North of the festival site.
- We have assigned traffic controllers to the corner of Midland Highway and Mount Mercer Road on Sunday 9 December to assist vehicles turning left or right onto Midland Highway from Mount Mercer Road.
- We will install a no-parking zone along Mount Mercer Road and some surrounding roads.

Middleton Walk

Advance Meredith

On Saturday 24th November at 4 pm a plaque will be unveiled at the Steiglitz Rd Entrance of the Middleton Walk.

The Middleton Walk which incorporates The Way of the Ibis is named after Ken Middleton who was the Shire Engineer of the Bannockburn Shire from 1964 until 1994, at which time most of the Shire was amalgamated with much of the Leigh and Grenville Shires to form the Golden Plains Shire. Ken was a man of great integrity and keen to promote the welfare of all residents of the Shire while performing his duties as Shire Engineer. During his time he was responsible for many things which we now take for granted. He was aware that most residents relied on private transport and did his best to realign roads and redesign bridges in order to make travel to local towns and regional centres easier and safer. He was secretary and Resident Engineer of the Bannockburn and District Water Trust which brought water to Bannockburn, Lethbridge and Meredith and the farms in between.

He was always interested in spaces for recreation for the public to use. Before amalgamation Fyansford was part of Bannockburn Shire and The Flume along the Barwon River which had supplied the paper mill in Geelong was a particular interest of his. It was as a result of his endeavours that this was restored and the area alongside and above it was revegetated, originally with a Community Tree planting event. (Unfortunately the original plaque which was unveiled at the opening has been removed, and replaced with one from the City of Greater Geelong which makes no mention of Bannockburn!)

The project to turn the old Railway Dam site at Lethbridge into a public recreation space was another initiative of his, as was enhancing many of the sporting facilities throughout the Shire. At Meredith where he had a property and which his family still farms, he envisaged the area along the Coolebahghurk Creek as a place for a public walking track, at that stage the only non road side walking track. He encouraged neighbouring property owners to refence their properties to the correct alignment so as not to encroach on the area. He took an active part in clearing the space of stones and in the preparation and tree planting of the area by the then Meredith Youth Group. During his term he ensured that the area was regularly mown. Without his foresight the Way of the Ibis could not have been established.

It is exciting that there is to be further development of the walking tracks at the Police Paddock and at Pioneer Park as Ken greatly assisted in the establishment of the latter. Maybe in the future, Middleton Walk can be extended as far as Creamery Rd.!

Members of the Community are invited to the unveiling of the plaque and for refreshments following at the Meredith Community Centre.


2nd 11 Gold

Recently, the Meredith and District Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) held its 6th AGM at Foxys. President Mary Foster presented her annual report and thanked all of our 12 committed active volunteers for their dedication in supporting the local community as emergency first responders. In addition, there are four new recruits waiting to be trained by Ambulance Victoria. 'We encourage members of the community to consider joining us in being trained for this most worthy cause', said Mary. The ongoing 2012-2013 CERT committee from left Martin, Rhonda, Zena, commitment of the committee was also acknowledged.

The group was successful in obtaining a Community Volunteers Grant which will provide a new Resusci Anne Manikin allowing members to practice their resuscitation skills. Mary further acknowledged the support of the local community both financially and in providing positive feedback on the work of the Group.

In her report, Team Leader Lynn Heard spoke about how busy the Group has been over the last year. In total, there have been 60 call outs the group has responded to. Lynn praised the care and professionalism of our CERT volunteers who respond to emergencies at all hours of the day and night. Lynn also thanked our wonderful trainers: Steve, Lynn and Susy, who visit us once a month throughout the year to ensure we are all up to scratch in delivering a great service to our local community.

Later this year, members of the CERT group will be getting new uniforms. The current green uniforms will be replaced with blue ones, similar to AV paramedics, but with green insignia. The exciting news is that the Meredith CERT is about to establish its new shed for housing its vehicle.

It has been agreed by the Education Department that we can erect the shed on the eastside of the Community Centre. This should be completed by early December and will give the CERT a permanent home at long last.

Jude Bolton's Meredith Connection

Jude Bolton, 2012 Swans Premiership player and AFL 300 gamer, has a Meredith connection. With a little cajoling from Marg Cooper, his mum, Rosalie Bolton recalls the time.

Jude was a toddler when we went to live in Meredith for

12 months, during his father John's time as HIS IS ONE STEP AWA Principal of the Primary School. Our family took over the school residence, which was a lovely rambling old weatherboard house with a big open fireplace and plenty of space for 3 boys.

Matthew was in Grade 4 and Dominic was in Grade 1 and Jude ran Free! After all, how many kids have a cricket and footy ground as their own backyard? Jude was

happy to see his Dad and brothers every day for lunch and I remember having to wrestle with a screeching toddler to get him back over the wire fence when he wanted to play with all the kids during recess times.

He doesn't remember much about our time at Meredith but thinks that it is pretty amazing that he

had a pet duck called "Duckins" whilst he was there. The elderly couple across the road from our house {next to the Blythe family} gifted the duck to him. It followed him everywhere and swam in his blue wading pool.

We had a great time in Meredith and the school community was warm and friendly. Alvie Wiseman had seen lots of Principals at Meredith come and go during her time and she was a great support. The boys quickly made

friends with the local children.

I remember a horrible time one night when we had to rush Jude from Meredith to Ballarat Base Hospital at a furious speed.

He had a "fever fit" after a bad dose of flu.

We'd tried Helen Anglin's remedy, a cold bath, but when he sank in a sort of coma the panic button was pressed.

We somehow survived the ordeal that many people in small country towns endure living without a hospital close by.

Jude was 12 years old when we moved to East Keilor from Ballarat. He was enrolled at St Bernard's College in Essendon.

WHEN your son plays football the way her's does, with seemingly no regard for his body, it's hardly surprising Rosalie Bolton regularly rings her boy to give her thoughts on his kamikaze style of play.

In year 12 at the time were 2 future footy stars, Matthew Lloyd and Scott Lucas and past players were Simon and Justin Madden. So the school boasted a fine football pedigree!

He played with the Calder Cannons for a few years in the TAC Cup before being drafted at No 8 to the Sydney Swans.

We have now enjoyed 14 seasons, following games in Sydney and

Melbourne as much as possible. Living at a new place in Strathmore gives us quick access to the Airport so we never feel too far away from family. Despite living in Sydney now for 15 years Jude remains loyal to his country roots and his old friends at Ballarat and St Bernards. Many of these friends were in the rooms celebrating with him after the 2012 Grand Final at the MCG on September 29, 2012.







They tell that the possibilities are endless and only limited by one's imagination.



Meredith History Interest Group

Cargerie Historical Walk

A walk on the Bakes property at Cargerie on Sunday, October 21 revealed some history that could get lost in time if not shared and recorded. Peter Griffiths, local historian, former resident of Grenville and the author of *Three Times Blest* told the crowd about George Frederick Read and his family and the properties that they occupied in early days in Victoria.

Janene Schillier {Bakes} led us through the lush green paddocks and around the picturesque big dams to show the features that make the history of this area so important. Philip Read and his daughter Isobell, who is the great, great, great grand daughter of G.F. Read of Cargerie, planted an oak tree at the original home site, below the track and above the ford where it is believed that Cobb and Co travelled and along the creek from the sheep wash. Muriel Toohey {Bakes} told how barren the landscape was when she arrived as wife of a Soldier Settler in 1952. George Frederick Read Jnr was born in Van Diemen's Land in 1817.

He was sent by his father to Port Phillip to take up a squatting run when he was 19 years of age. It is believed that he was the only Australian-born squatter to take up land in Victoria.

He set sail from Launceston with 675 sheep on board the ship *John Dunscombe* and arrived at Point Henry on May 5, 1837 to establish a station near Modewarre. In November 1837 he heard of a good extensive run on the Leigh River and Cargerie Creek near Meredith. He decided to occupy the run, naming it "Cargerie" and erected a temporary homestead of wood thatched with bark. The property comprised 23,710 acres and was held by the Read family until 1859.He married Helen Patterson and they had three children. George Frederick Read died at Cargerie on February 26, 1854, aged just 37. His father had purchased a property of 787 acres in 1845 and named it "Terona".

This area is now the suburb of Belmont in Geelong.

George Frederick's only surviving son, Alexander Read, purchased "Lawaluk" at Mt Mercer and this property was owned by the Read family until 1969.

LAND SELECTION AT GEELONG. (from our own correspondent.) The land selection took place this day (Wednesday), at the court-house, and was well attended. At ten o'clock, the time for closing the gates, there were at least 1,800 people present. This was quite unexpected by the land officers, and caused a great amount of inconvenience, as the courthouse was altogether incapable of holding more than a third of those present. A small stockade had been erected outside, but even then any amount of crushing ensued. A large number of ladies were present, and amongst the crowd were bankers and lawyers and their clerks, the principal mercantile men of the town and district, and a very large number who looked like bona fide settlers. The land was situate at Narmbool and Cargerie, distant about twenty miles from Geelong, near the River Leigh, and not above the average quality. At two o'clock the whole of the tickets were issued and placed in the ballot-box, and the drawing commenced. The number of tickets issued were said to be near a thousand. The following were the fortunate selectors:---Richard Coverdale, 289 acres, Narmbool; Thos. Devitt, 180 acres, Narmbool; Mary Bohan, 320 acres, Cargerie; John Hubbard, Fyansford, 166 acres, Cargerie; John Hucker, Bellerine, 536 acres, Narmbool; Thos. Fitzpatrick and Michael Green, St. Alban's, 632 acres, Narmbool; John Osborne, Ballan, 277 acres, Narmbool and Cargerie; Patrick Ryan, farmer, Lake Connewarre, 72 acres, Cargerie; Jane Helms, Barrabool-hills, 295 acres, Narmbool; Timothy Brennan, Kildare, 520 acres, Narmbool; Thomas Hastie, Buninyong, 270 acres, Narmbool; Duncan M'Naughton, Inver- leigh, 376 acres, Cargerie; Jno. M'Donald, Inglewood, 472 acres, Narmbool; James Creed, Pollocksford, 484 acres, Cargerie; Jno. Mulgueeney, Smeaton, 594 acres, Narmbool; James Bohun, Kildare, 480 acres, Narmbool; James Leckie, Ballarat, 236 acres, Cargerie; Frank Hewitt, Duneed, 204 acres, Cargerie; James Rigney, Geelong, 193 acres, Cargerie; Mary Carroll, St. Kilda, 103 acres, Cargerie; Robert Steward, declined to select; W. J. Reid, Meredith, 240 acres, Narmbool; John Stewart, Werribee, 117 Narmbool; Albert Benarl, German Town, 100 acres, Cargerie; Alexander Fraser, Geelong, 152 acres, Narmbool; Alexander Patrick Campbell, Melbourne, 58 acres, Cargerie; Anne Dwyer, Buninyong, 61 acres, Narmbool; John Tracey, sen., 51 acres, Cargerie. The whole land open was taken by soon after five o'clock. The court, upon the readmission, was so full that after some little disturbance the officer ordered the ballot box to be taken outside the court, each selector being accompanied by a constable into the building as his name came out of the box to complete his selection. The greatest possible interest was taken, and had there been ten times the quantity of land open it would have been selected. As it was, hundreds went away disappointed. The land was principally leased, and but very few certificates were made use of. The amount received was £455 6s.6d.

The following, from the Geelong Advertiser, may be taken for what it is worth:—" A strange piece of conduct on the part of the Hon. J.M. Grant has been reported to us by a selector in Cargerie, which, if we are not misinformed, ought certainly to be inquired into. Our informant states that about two years ago he selected 495 acres of land in Cargerie. A few months after-wards 118 acres were taken away from him, on the grounds that the land was required for an industrial school; no such school has been erected, but other persons have been allowed to select the land under the 42nd clause.

Nolan Family Buninyong Cemetery Expedition

Marg Cooper

The Nolan family reconnected with their forebears at the Buninyong Cemetery on Sunday October 14.

They also connected with relations from at least 3 branches of the family that came from Ireland.

Patrick and Margaret Nolan {Hansberry} from Galway departed from Dublin with their 7 youngest children on December 18, 1854 on the Rienzi. They arrived in Melbourne on April 22, 1855. Their 2 older children, Michael 20 and Bridget 21 had arrived on the "Mangerton" at Geelong on June 5, 1852 as assisted immigrants. Family history tells that they walked to Bungal where they were contracted to George Edgerton for 12 months, for £25 per annum with rations.

Their eldest son Martin who was born about 1828 served some time in the English Army in India and married in India and had 6 children before they immigrated to Australia and settled near Buninyong. Patrick died in 1878 and his Will records that he had an interest in 20 acres of land in the Parish of Yarrowee, County of Grenville held under license from the Crown with improvements being a 20 X 14 feet stable built of slabs and with a bark roof, erected 18 years ago, a 2 roomed weatherboard cottage with a bark roof erected 18 years ago, a 30 X 14 feet barn built of board with a shingle roof erected 18 years ago, post and rail fencing and an interest in 22 acres at Black Lead.

Peter Nolan the 5th child of Patrick and Margaret took up title to the land at Cargerie in 1865 although they farmed the land earlier. He married Alice Halfpenny and they had one son John. John married Mary O'Neil and they had 10 children including James Edward Nolan who married Elizabeth Bowman.

John Nolan who lives and farms the Cargerie land is the son of Jim and Bessie Nolan.

It is believed that the Nolan family may be the only family in Cargerie who are still on the land originally selected by their forebears.

Over 90 family members gathered at the Buninyong Cemetery at 11 am, were issued with a name tag and a map of the cemetery that showed the position of the Nolan graves and walked the cemetery and listened to stories about their ancestors.

The crowd then adjourned to the Buninyong Town Hall for a group photo before devouring a delicious lunch supplied by the Meredith Kindergarten Committee.

Video recordings were made of interviews with the 'elders' – Margaret Dunn, Nell Tucker, John, Martin and James Nolan. A display of Nolan family trees and Nolan memorabilia created much interest and there was lots of talking and catching up and meeting other Nolans. Finding themselves in the framework of the family tree was a revelation and joy for many, and interest and curiosity was awakened to appreciate and experience clan Nolan in new ways.

Mary and John Nolan tell that in 2015 the Nolan family will have been in Australia for 160 years, the Nolan family will have had title to the land at Cargerie for 150 years, Mary and John will have been married for 50 years and the Music Festival will celebrate 25 years. They would like to celebrate these significant dates and would like to make a record of the Nolan Family History. They invite people to contribute ideas and information as to how to celebrate and to record!



Celestine by Gillian Tindall

The book is sub-titled "Voices from a French Village". The English author and her husband bought a house in a small village in central rural France, outside the tourist circuit and largely unexplored even in literature.

She became interested in the history of the village, assiduously collected, developed a network of helpers, material bits found their way into her possession and people talked to her.

When she acquired a footstool embroidered with a cat by Celestine, some table napkins from Celestine's trousseau and a cache of tightly folded love letters to Celestine in a deserted house, she may have decided to centre the book on this character.

The book is all true and is crammed with historical fact.

The author has used many sources for the history including municipal registers, newspapers, military records, census records, land registry records and novels written in various eras. Celestine, the daughter of an inn-keeper was born in 1844 and died in 1933.

The author tells us that her lifespan roughly coincided with the great transformation in France of peasants into citizens and the death of subsistence farming.

The author describes Celestine only in silhouette but her story guides the narrative back to her great grandfather, sideways to other kin and neighbours and forwards to son and grandchild. All this is written in the context of changing seasons and conditions in France over hundreds of years and the varied spans of individual lives.

The book has been described as "a meditation on time itself, part biography, part history of a locality and part study of great historical change".

In the book there are many diversions, crooked ways and cul-de-sacs.

The author skirts around things, leaves gaps or dangles a tale in front of us to leave it more untold than told.

It was suggested that she used this method because with history there is always more to be said and more to be collected and interpreted.

The historical events that affected the village like the wars, the changes in village life like the replacement of washing clothes on the rocks in the stream with a private laundry or "lavoir" and the insights into individual lives are fascinating. But the book is fairly difficult to read because it is very detailed, has not really got a story line and contains many French names and quotes.

The book for discussion in November is "As I Walked Out One Midsummer Morning" by Laurie Lee.
