#### **Local Grants**

District Community Organisations received valued financial help late last month when, at a ceremony held at the Meredith Memorial Hall, the Golden Plains Shire 2016/17 Community Grants were announced. The 47 recipients received amounts ranging from a few hundred dollars, to \$5,000, on a matching basis. Among them, were:

**Meredith and District Lions Club** - \$5,000 Pioneer Park playground - Construction of a nature based playground at Pioneer Park in Meredith, to replace the existing playground equipment.

Meredith History Interest Group Inc. - \$2,100 Document advancement project - Purchase of a new commercial quality printer to produce quality copies of documents, maps, photos etc.

**Meredith Kindergarten Inc.** - \$2,389 Road safety awareness/caring for the environment - Purchase of bikes, scooters and signs to conduct road safety awareness education. Installation of a natural barrier around the sandpit.

Meredith Police Paddocks Support Group - \$4,339 Meredith Police Paddocks entrances - The design and construction of entrance fencing, gateways and landscaping at both Campion Rd & Nuttall St entrances to present welcoming entry points to the reserve.

**Meredith Recreation Reserve** - \$2,000 Outdoor BBQ area - Construction of an outdoor BBQ area.

On June 15th representatives from the Meredith Lions Club were presented with a \$30,000 grant from the Geelong Community Foundation to start the building of a new multi-stage playground at Pioneer Park. The playspace will eventually cater for children from preschool through to pre-teens. The Lions Club have been working very hard with the Meredith Playgroup and Meredith Community Centre with the assistance of the Fund for Rural and Regional Renewal (F.R.R.R.) to provide an adventure playground to challenge and engage the imagination of the young people of the district, and to provide risk-taking opportunities in a safe and family oriented space.

Greetings to all readers of the Meredith and district newsletter.

Firstly I would like to report that at the Geelong Magistrates Court on Thursday the 14<sup>th</sup> July Paul Mathew COOK of Norlane entered a plea of guilty on all charges relating to my arrest of him in September last year after I executed a search warrant at his Thomson Road, Norlane address.

These charges included handling stolen goods, possessing unregistered firearms and ammunition, possessing a pistol, possessing the proceeds of crime together with other drug and serious property related offences including theft of diesel from a Meredith farm.

This will be the third consecutive court appearance and subsequent conviction for COOK for crime that he has committed in and around Meredith and throughout the western region over the past twelve months. This has been a very complex and lengthy investigation and COOK will be sentenced at the Geelong Magistrates Court in August. I sincerely thank the witnesses that assisted me greatly throughout the past ten months of this investigation both locally and from other parts of the western region.

On the 14<sup>th</sup> July a report was received relating to two males driving an early model Ford Falcon ute where they stopped at a property in Settlers Valley Road, Meredith. These two males one aged in his mid 30's and the second being around 50 years of age were clearly attempting to drag the victims dog towards the ute. When the victim appeared both immediately released the German Shepard and left the area. I would ask residents in the area to be vigilant for any future incidents of this nature and to contact police in the event of a similar occurrence.

This can be done anonymously to Crime Stoppers on 1800 333000 to me at the Meredith Police Station by calling 52 861222 and leaving a voice message.



#### "In Praise of Weeds"

It is raining and it seems years since we had good winter rains in our district. The paddocks are green and the home garden is thick with weeds. Controlling weeds is an ongoing and never-ending task, but do consider that there are benefits to these 'unwanted' plants. By now you may be familiar with the health benefits of many 'wild' plants as they have become fashionable. A friend even noticed bunches of nettles on sale at a farmers' market recently. However weeds can be useful to incorporate into our gardening practices also. The vigorous root systems of the wild brassicas, docks, mallows and dandelions help to aerate the soil in an uncultivated area and then contribute organic matter as they break down. Hence I am going to sing the praises of weeds, so switch off now if you are offended! As I do not use any poisons in our garden I have accepted the inevitability of days spent hand weeding noting of course that a more organised person would weed before the seeds form.

Some years bring along a particular weed crop and this year stinging nettles (*Urtica dioica*) are thriving throughout my garden. A friend once told me that nettles thrive where the soil is healthy, and are an indication that the soil is high in nutrients particularly phosphorous. However when I see the thousands of tiny seeds on every single nettle plant I reckon that they are able to establish themselves far and wide no matter the soil quality. In fact the nettle <u>adds</u> nutrients to the earth, so I blithely throw great armfuls into the compost.

I also intend to make a nutrient rich nettle 'tea' and include here this note from Gardening Australia for Stinging Nettle Tonic.

The nettle "is high in nitrogen so it promotes good leafy growth. Roughly chop up 1.5 kgs of stinging nettle and then add 4.5 litres of water. In a week or so this mixture will have started to ferment. The liquid can then be used diluted or undiluted as a foliar spray."


The tea is a good idea when the plants have gone to seed so as not to encourage its further spread. I also chop up the plants and use them as mulch, or dig them in as green manure and the goodness is taken up by the soil as the plant matter breaks down.


Nettles have proved beneficial for humans. They contain minerals that are essential for good health - magnesium, iron and calcium - so use the leaves in soups, cook up as you would spinach and as a tea. It's good to know that the native nettle Urtica incisa has been spotted in our district. Naturally many other weeds abound and while many are problematic some can be put to good use once harvested. Common weeds around here are purslane - a

succulent prostrate annual used in cooking and apparently rich in the omega-3 fatty acids. We are responsible for many of the roadside escapees such as the wild brassicas including those from the mustard family. These I dig in to the vegie patch as a natural 'bio-fumigant' to prepare the soil where I will plant members of the solanceae family such as tomatoes and potatoes.

Oh dear, so much to talk about and not enough space. I am going outside now to cover the asparagus bed in manure and compost and water it in with a tea concocted from sea grass.







# What is "Battery-Ready" Solar Power ? (Part 3)

In recent instalments, I have considered Grid-Connected Solar Power Systems with Batteries ... and stated that buying a "Battery Ready" Solar Power System now (or retrofitting Batteries onto Existing Solar Power Systems) needs to be done carefully in order to achieve a purchaser's actual goals --- The Devil is in the (Technical) Detail!!!

A Grid-Connect Solar Power System uses a Grid-Connect Solar Inverter to convert the Direct Current from the Panels to the 240V AC of the Mains Grid. Charging Batteries requires adding a Battery Inverter-Charger and an Import/Export Meter.

The Solar Inverter and the Battery Inverter-Charger can be in one box (a "One Box Solution") or separate (a "Two Box Solution"). One fundamental difference is that a "One Box Solution" is always from a single manufacturer whereas a "Two Box Solution" might use equipment from different manufacturers. In which case compatibility must be considered.

Firstly, unless there is an explicit partnership between manufacturers or an explicit statement that a Battery Inverter-Charger works with "<u>all</u> Solar Inverters", it is unclear whether your Warranty will be intact and whether you will receive Technical Support from either manufacturer.

Secondly, the solar power must "go somewhere" and putting more power into Batteries that are fully-charged can damage them. In a Grid-Connect System, if the Solar Inverter produces more power than the Batteries can take, the excess automatically flows back to the Mains Grid (regardless of any explicit compatibility between manufacturers). But in an Off-Grid System, or an On-Grid System providing Backup when the Mains Grid is down, there is nowhere for excess power to go. The only way to avoid over-charging the Batteries is for the Inverter-Charger to tell the Solar Inverter to reduce the amount of power produced. That requires a compatible way of communicating and only exists in products from the same manufacturer or where manufacturers adhere to the same Standards or where another mechanism has been deliberately implemented.

Another difference is the way permission to connect a Solar Power System with Batteries to the Mains Grid is granted. In the Powercor Network (most of Western Victoria), a Maximum Amount of Power Exported back to the Mains Grid must be approved. For a "One Box Solution" this is simply the AC Output of the One Box. But in the case of a "Two Box Solution", the combined AC Output of both the Solar Inverter and Inverter -Charger might need to be approved, which can make it harder to keep below the maximum permitted and still provide enough power on the premises.

If the total AC Output of the Solar Inverter and Inverter-Charger exceed the maximum permitted, we can still install explicitly-approved Export-limiting Inverters ... but that restricts us to more sophisticated (more expensive !!!) brands. Over coming months, I will consider the most cost-effective ways to install a Brand New Battery-Ready Solar Power System and to retrofitting an Existing Solar Power System ...

Teresa and Shane Telford sold many of their possessions and headed off from Portarlington in 2011 with a camper trailer and a 4WD to see Australia. They zig-zagged up the east coast, had a few weeks holiday before looking for work, spent 2½ years in McKay, Teresa working in cafes and Shane working in construction and the mines, living in the caravan park and experiencing two cyclones before they headed for Darwin.

Teresa obtained a job within two weeks in the Speaker's Corner Café at Parliament House with Karen Sheldon Catering and Shane soon got a job with a building company. Teresa was very impressed by Karen Sheldon. Teresa described her as an amazing woman who is humble with a real passion to help people, especially the indigenous population. As well as the catering business she started the first Vocational Training and Employment Centre which offers nationally accredited and non-accredited training in mentoring, life skills, hospitality, retail and administration. With the programs and practical experience in her businesses Australia's most highly disadvantaged indigenous can and do enter the mainstream workforce. Teresa believes that it is working well!

Teresa's job as manager of the café was challenging but enjoyable. The staff included a chef and at least three trainees at a time. Teresa learnt a lot about indigenous people and became very sensitive to their culture. She recommends the Parliament House Café as the best place to be in Darwin. The building contains the Parliament and the local library and many tourists visit. The café won the Golden Plate Awards in 2013, 2014 and 2015.

Later in their stay Shane also worked for Karen Sheldon in a mentoring role. His job was to support trainees which was a big change from building.

Last Christmas when they came home to Meredith they noticed a house in Mercer Street for sale, had a look, thought it had potential and made an offer. They sorted out the finer details from Darwin and thought they may rent it out and stay in Darwin for a bit longer but home was beckoning. Teresa grew up in Meredith and is the daughter of Mary and Greg Foster. They arrived the week it snowed!

Teresa is feeling the cold especially when she plays football.

While in Darwin she joined a new team called the Wanderers. The first year they were second from the bottom of the ladder, the second year they made the finals and the third year they narrowly lost the Grand Final. She was picked up by the Northern Territory State Academy and played interstate matches with them. Now she is playing with the Geelong VFL team. In Darwin football was played in summer!





#### Vale Brian Stanley

It was raining on Thursday July 7, 2016 when Brian's body was interred at Steiglitz Cemetery. He would have been happy because he knew how important rain was to farmers. Brian and his brother Bill grew onions, seed potatoes and other vegetables, for many years on their own land and leased land.

Brian, Bill and Wendy were the children of Gwen and Maurice Stanley of Steiglitz. Their mother ran the Post Office and telephone exchange in Regent Street. Brian and Bill attended Caulfield Technical School for about five years of their secondary education and stayed with their maternal grandmother while in Melbourne.

When they returned home the boys worked with their father, growing peas and onions, sawing wood and carting it to Geelong before they began growing vegetables on "Ballark" in the 1940's. This relationship with the Molesworth family continued until 2000.


Brian and Bill always worked together. They cut and sold slate from the Brisbane ranges, they worked at Meredith Engineering for Jim Cole and they worked at International Harvester in Geelong. They played football for Meredith and were in the Meredith team which were Premiers in the Ballarat District Section in 1960. Brian also played a season with Ballarat Football Club.

Brian married Elaine Osborne in 1959 and they had a daughter and a son, Karen and Daryl. They relocated a house from Box Hill to Meredith and situated it on Ballan Road. The three Stanley houses there were affectionately nicknamed "Stanleyville" because Gwen and Maurice Stanley lived in the house that had previously been the Meredith Catholic Presbytery and Bill and Joyce lived in another house that had been moved to Meredith.

Brian was a keen gardener. He joined the Pelargonium Club at the Geelong Botanical Gardens in 2003 and loved to propagate pelargoniums from cuttings. Meredith people may remember the rows of dahlias that he grew in the paddock near their house. He sold bunches of the flowers at nearby markets.

Brian suffered a stroke in 2005 and worked hard to improve his mobility. Brian and Elaine moved to a new unit in Bannockburn in 2010 and enjoyed catching up with all the Meredith people living in Bannockburn but in 2012 Brian moved to Bannockburn Aged Care and died on Tuesday, June 28, 2016.

#### Vale Maureen Henderson

Maureen was born in Colac on March 9, 1921 to Dick and Mary Rantall. She was the fourth of their nine children. During her formative years she experienced the Roaring Twenties, the devastation of the Great Depression and then the Second World War. These were tough times for families but think of all the innovations she saw during her lifetime.

The family lived in Apollo Bay and she went to school there. After school she helped her mother at home, especially with the younger children and she enjoyed fishing with her father. Maureen met Douglas Henderson in Geelong and they married on September 10, 1942 at St David's Church, Newtown. Their honeymoon was short as Doug was on leave from the Army so they only had a couple of days together.

After the war they moved to 27 Wallace Street, Meredith where they lived for 62 years. Maureen was a "home body", she was thoroughly content in her apron at home. She would change into a clean apron or "pinny" when guests arrived. She was a great cook and there was always plenty of home baked food to eat. She loved her garden which was full of dahlias, irises, Soldier Boys" and gladiolus (the bulbs of which were given to her by her brothers and sister). As well as a beautiful flower garden Maureen and Doug had an abundant vegetable garden.

They had four children, Helen, Donald (dec.), Allan and Lorraine. They were also proud and loving grandparents to ten grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren, who Maureen affectionately called the "littlies". She was always interested in what the family was doing and always knew when their birthdays were, sending a card and a note of money.

They had a small farm at Bamganie which had previously been owned by Doug's parents, Joseph and Ellen. They would work there at weekends. Neither Maureen nor Doug were afraid of hard work and, of course, during the season Maureen catered for the shearers. She also supported Doug in his roles in the Fire Brigade, State School, Landcare and Senior Citizens.

Maureen was an active member of Meredith CWA, the Mother's Club and Meredith Senior Citizens. She particularly loved performing in sketches at CWA with Mary Brady who was a great friend of Maureen's and lived over the road from her. Mary believed that a nip of green ginger wine before a performance ensured that the cast relaxed and performed well and they did!

Due to Doug's poor health Maureen and Doug moved to a unit in Bannockburn in 2002 where Maureen took wonderful care of Doug for several years. Sadly Doug died in Bannockburn Nursing Home in 2011. He was 93 years old. Maureen stayed in the unit until 2014 when she moved into the Nursing Home herself.

Maureen was taken to hospital on Sunday, June 26 and died peacefully the next day. She was 95 years old. The family reflected on Maureen's long, healthy, beautiful life. She loved her family, had a great sense of humour, was quick witted and very much a lady.

Look in the mirror and smile at yourself. Now notice your teeth. At the front, you have four incisors at the top and four at the bottom. These teeth are shaped like chisels with a narrow edge for cutting. Beside the incisors are canines, also called eye teeth, which are pointed for tearing tough food. Further back are your premolars and molars which are used for crushing and grinding food into small enough pieces to swallow. These teeth have dips and raised portions arranged in such a way that the top and bottom teeth fit together and work together. People are omnivores and their teeth are adapted to eating meat, which is cut and torn, and plant material which often needs to be ground. Sugar gliders are also omnivores, so they have incisors, canines, premolars and molars as we do. However, their diet is different to ours. They eat insects, spiders and other invertebrates, as well as gum, sap, nectar and pollen. Their teeth have an adaptation to this diet with two long sharp bottom incisors to cut through bark, allowing them to lick up the sap oozing from the wound they have chewed in the tree.

Carnivores eat mainly meat and need to be able to cut it with their teeth. Some of their molars and sometimes premolars are large with sharp edges, and are called carnassials. As the animal bites into meat, these teeth pass each other and slice the meat into more manageable sized pieces. Tasmanian devils have teeth of this type as did thylacines. Carnivores often have a ridge along the top of their skull and strong cheek bones. Large muscles are attached to these, giving them the biting power they need. They don't chew food. It is swallowed in chunks, so their stomachs contain much stronger acid than omnivores or herbivores, to help them to digest their meals. Brush-tailed phascogales are small marsupial carnivores which are found in our area. Although their food is similar to sugar gliders, they eat less nectar and have not been observed eating sap. A lot more of their diet is made up of live prey, including small mammals, lizards and birds. They also have large front incisors, but unlike sugar gliders, they have large canines and sharp triangular premolars and molars. There is a gap in front of their top canines, allowing space for their lower canines to fit when they close their mouth. Their teeth are useful for gripping, holding and tearing their meals.

Herbivores have incisors, but often lack canines. Their molars are large with ridges to help grind their food. They have a long jaw and strong cheek bones as anchor points for the large muscles which they need for chewing tough plants. The length of their jaw creates a long gap between their incisors and molars, and gives them room to move food around for repeated chewing and mixing with saliva, so that it is already partially digested before it reaches the stomach. Our local eastern grey kangaroos have teeth of this kind for eating grass. On each side of their mouth they have one pair of premolars and four pairs of big molars. These gradually wear out. The ones towards the front fall out and the rear teeth move forward to replace them. Koalas, with their diet of gum leaves, also have the teeth of a herbivore. On each side they have a large pair of incisors at the front for cutting, then two smaller pairs and small canines. The gap between the front and back teeth is shorter than in kangaroos, so they have a shorter face. Their

molars wear as they age and become flatter.

Another group with specialised teeth are the rodents. They have two pairs of long incisors with thick enamel at the front. The back of these teeth have little enamel and wear away, leaving a sharp point at the front. Their incisors grow continuously, so the animals have to gnaw to prevent them from becoming too long. Most rodents have a gap with no canines or premolars, but have molars for chewing. Their diets vary. Two native rodents which may be found locally are bush rats which are omnivorous, and water rats which are mainly carnivorous. Other rodents are herbivorous. Animals have teeth and bodies which are adapted to their diet. If you find a skull, have a look at its shape and teeth. They are large clues to identifying the animal and its lifestyle.

#### Slow-Cooked Veal and Rosemary Casserole

Prep & Cooking Time 8 hours 35 minutes Serves 6

#### **Ingredients**

3/4 cup plain flour

1.2kg boned veal shoulder, cut coarsely

1 tablespoon olive oil

1 medium brown onion, chopped

coarsely

2 garlic cloves, crushed

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup (125ml) dry red wine

2 medium carrots, chopped coarsely

2 stalks celery, trimmed, chopped

coarsely

2 medium parsnips, chopped coarsely

2 ½ cups beef stock

3 sprigs rosemary

#### Method

Season flour in a large bowl, add veal, toss to coat in flour. Shake off excess. Heat half the oil in large frying pan; cook veal in batches, until browned. Transfer to 4.5-litre (18 cup) slow cooker.

Heat remaining oil in same pan; cook onion and garlic, stirring, until onion softens. Add wine, bring to the boil. Boil uncovered, until liquid reduces by half.

Stir onion mixture into slow cooker with carrot, celery, parsnip, stock and rosemary. Cook, covered, on low for 8 hours. Season to taste.

#### **Books that Talk**

Simon Winchester has just read me his book "Krakatoa" about the volcanic island west of Java that was annihilated on August 27, 1883, the day the world exploded! The effects of this explosion were felt around the world. He has also read to me his book "The Map that Changed the World" about the exploits of geologist and map maker William Smith. What a privilege and a joy to listen to an author read his own words to me.

Evan McHugh's books "Outback Stations of Australia" and "The Shearers" were also recently read to me and were enthralling to listen to. I heard about big stations including "Adria Downs", "Wave Hill" and "Commonwealth Hill "and characters such as Nat Buchanan in the first book and about the men who went out to shear sheep armed with blades and a sense of adventure and shaped the Australian National character in the second book.

These audio books came from the Golden Plains Mobile Library which visits Meredith every Thursday from 9 am until 10.30am and parks outside Meredith Community Centre. On board are books for all ages, DVD's, CD's, magazines and audio books. Also on board is Kay who quietly records items borrowed and returned, encourages borrowing and, when her opinion is sought, recommends.

She describes how the truck has a "floating collection" - the items in the truck change all the time. An additional service is the ability to order online from the library catalogue. When your order becomes available the library will notify you and you can pick up from the truck.

Kay has been driving the present Library Truck for 17 years. When she started she drove a semi-trailer. On Thursdays she arrives at the depot in Anakie Road about 7.45 am, is in Meredith before 9 am to connect to power, open the doors and get her computer going. She then drives the truck to Rokewood, Dereel and Enfield so people can borrow from the library in those districts. She drives to other districts on other days. Kay always runs early and enjoys casting her eye over the countryside to observe the different seasons. An avid reader all her life, Kay has a real passion for her work.

A \$130,000 refurbishment of the Mobile Library is to take place soon. While the truck is off the road a van will service the country towns at the usual times and locations. The mobile library is a wonderful service available to the community. May I also recommend the audio books? Listening to them in the car makes the trip entertaining!

#### The Battle of Fromelles

The Battle of Fromelles was a British Military operation on the Western Front on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> July, 1916, during World War 1, subsidiary to the Battle of the Somme. The attack was the debut of the Australian Imperial Force on the Western Front and the Australian War Memorial describes the battle as "the worst 24 hours in Australia's entire history". Of 7,080 British Empire Force casualties, 5,533 losses were incurred by the 5<sup>th</sup> Australian Division.

Charles John Wyatt was killed on 19/7/1916. He was the son of William and Elizabeth Wyatt of Meredith. Their children included Ginerva Mary Wyatt b. 1892 at Meredith, Charles John Wyatt b. 1893 at Meredith, Thomas Edward Wyatt b. 1897 at Meredith, Robert Healey Wyatt b. 1900 at Meredith and Evelyn May Wyatt b. 1906 at Meredith. Locals recall the Wyatt family living in Read Street, Meredith and that William Wyatt was a ganger on the railways. When he enlisted Charles was 21 years of age, was 5 feet 4 inches tall, of dark complexion with curly hair, blue eyes, was single and Roman Catholic.

He enlisted on 12/7/1915. A "send off" was held on 27/10/1915 in Geelong with his embarkation on HMAT "Wiltshire" on 18/11/1915. Charles Wyatt was reported missing on 16/7/1916 and then listed as killed in action on 19/7/1916 at the Battle of Fromelles.

Mr Willetts of Geelong presented an enlarged framed photo of Pte C. Wyatt to the Meredith State School. Pte C. Wyatt was an old boy of the school and at the time of his enlistment was in Mr Willetts' employ. The Head Teacher proposed to try and have portraits of all "old" boys who had enlisted, placed in the school. On the Monday after his family received confirmation that he had been killed in action the State School flag was flown at half-mast in honour of the memory of the first of the old scholars to give his life for his country.

Charles John Wyatt has no known grave but is commemorated at VC Corner (Panel 23) at Fromelles, on the Meredith State School Roll of Honor, on the Meredith and District Roll of Honor, on the Meredith War Memorial and on Panel 171 at the Australian War Memorial.

#### "Hello Beautiful" by Hannie Rayson

Hannie Rayson is a playwright and screenwriter. Her works which include "Hotel Sorrento", "Inheritance" and "Life after George" have been performed around Australia and internationally and she has received numerous awards.

Hannie Rayson a writer, mother, daughter, sister, wife, romantic, adventuress and parking spot optimist has spent a lifetime giving voice to others in the many roles she has written for stage and screen. She explains how this can be exhausting because to be in one of her plays the characters must be volatile and emote. The Prologue says that she has spent 30 years pretending to be other people but for reasons she cannot explain she has woken up and found herself interesting.

Hannie takes centre stage in this book. It is a collection of her stories, some of which began their lives as articles in the Age or HQ magazine. All of them have been reworked with a simple rule: everything has to be true, more or less. She filled gaps in her memory from the contents of a camphorwood box which her father gave her when she was sixteen. In it, she kept every piece of writing (including her personal diaries) she had scribbled since she was a teenager.

In the early chapters she resurrects the textures of suburban life in 1960's and 1970's Melbourne where everyone on the street knew everyone else's business. She flicks from the lurid tale of the murder victim buried under her mother's house, of the miscarriage she suffered as a young journalist in Arthur Boyd's studio, to a slapstick dinner party disaster, to giving birth during the nurse's strike in 1986. Chapters burst with witty anecdotes and intelligent insights about balding men, step families, graffiti, leaking, Billy Crystal and much more.

This book is easy to read and very entertaining with many subjects to which readers can relate. Hannie nourishes your soul and draws you into her personal and creative world. She has had "a not so ordinary life"! The book for discussion in August is "I am Malala" by Malala Yousafzai with Christina Lamb.

#### Letter to the Editor

Sir, — I wonder how many of your readers were pupils of Dolly's Creek school in the early seventies. Not many, I fear. Where are the hundred (more or less) happy boys and girls who played games and fought fights in the good old schoolboy fashion? Cricket, rounders, prisoners' bar, shinty—the latter played with ball and crooked stick, and Jove help the shins and ankles of him who failed to "shinty his own side." As I write the thrill and joy of youth returns in imagination.

Some family names as I remember them were: — Horner, Gus, Tom, Jane; Eastwood, George, and sisters, Maria and Fanny; Barker, Jack, Walter, Bob; McIntosh, Ralph: McDonald, Charlie and Norman; Miles, Harry and Bill; Johnson, Edmond and George (the father a colored man, was a pugilist of no mean order, and was looked upon by us boys as champion of the countryside); Hunter, Bill; Jackson, Jim; Webster, Welbourne and Wilfred; Elmslie, George, Harry and Bill (the firstnamed well known later in Victorian politics); Hollingsworth, sisters Priscilla and Lily; Jerram, Bill, and sisters Jane, Ellen, Dorcus, Jessie, Tilly, Alice, Lizzie (Bill's boat-building business near Princes-bridge is well known); Fitzpatrick, Bob, and sister, Jenny (an elder brother known as "Snowy" had finished school at this time, and later became known in connection with the Kelly gang); Smith, Jock and Babe; Watt, Jim, Joe and Bob; Waters, Sandy, Bill and Gilbert; Monroe, Bill, Lavery and Jack; and many others whose names do not occur to me at the moment.

Should this meet the eye of any old boys or girls they will not be surprised to hear that the building has long since been demolished, and the site overgrown with timber, just as were the surroundings in our day. About two years ago I visited the place — Oh, so desolate!— not a vestige of habitation remained.

How pleasant it would be if the few old boys who are left, with perhaps some of their off-spring, could get together and have a day back to Dolly's Creek.



#### New Dispensing Robot - starts Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> August

Last month you would have read that we are building a brand new dispensary in the pharmacy as we are putting in an automated dispensing robot! Our renovations are well underway and there has been minimal disruption which has been a bonus. Our new automated dispensing robot will be built from Monday 15th August and will be ready to go from Monday 22nd August. This automated dispensing technology leaves the picking/selection of the medications to the robot which means our Pharmacists have more time to provide consultations and better health outcomes for our customers. The majority of the time taken to dispense a medication is taken up with selecting medication from the shelves and this new robot will do this for us, and will only take a few seconds to accurately select the product for us. A member of our dispensary team still has to dispense the prescription through our dispensing software to ensure the correct medication is prescribed, etc, but then the robot will select the medication for us and we complete the final labelling and checking process. We already pride ourselves on our efficiency but this automated dispensing robot will dramatically reduce the wait times for your prescriptions. A picture of the robot can be seen below. We will also have a TV screen set up in the Pharmacy which will allow everyone to see inside the robot and the robotic arm grabbing the medications. Kids especially (and adults) love to watch the robot
