



The Red Tape Roundabout

'Red tape'...simple words, yet capable of striking terror into Aussie's across the land.

These words have the power to make shoulders of the strongest men sag. Ensure the most optimistic hippy's smile disappears. And, as we all know, once the term is uttered, hours, days, even months suddenly get sucked into a frustratingly futile, time-

A tiny not-for-profit group, the Back to Steiglitz Association (BtS), know that feeling only too well. This handful of passionate volunteers have been fighting red tape for over 6 years now...and still chasing their own tails.

Why? The BtS are trying to save part of Australia's heritage; an irreplaceable school building. It's the last standing in, what a Heritage Report deems 'one of the most important early gold rush towns in Victoria,'...Steiglitz. Amongst the best ghost

towns in Australia, it's also the last town in Victoria without electricity. Over 60,000 tourists visit annually. Amidst its handful of historic buildings, is one designed by architect Henry Sadly, this long-Bastow. neglected schoolhouse now sits derelict.

So what's the problem?

BtS can't convince the town's custodians (Parks Victoria) to support them. Parks are the official protectors of everything Steiglitz; including its public buildings. Budget cuts left them

basically broke. Yet fulfilling their custodial obligations takes money...lots of it!

This is why, over 30 years ago, Parks and BtS joined forces in a 'you-scratch-my-back-I'll-scratch-yours' relationship. worked their tails off, and Parks provided Public Liability Insurance (PLI) for their fundraising events. Throughout those years, the copious BtS working bees, meetings, and awardwinning fundraisers, have helped save this quirky town from slowly disappearing. All a great effort, considering none of it is their responsibility!

Here's where the tail chasing begins...

Recently, Parks told BtS they'd no longer provide PLI. Though naturally they'll accept event proceeds!

However, every dollar BtS raise maintains Parks-managed buildings. They can't afford PLI. Yet without insurance, events can't occur. Without events, there's no money. And without BtS money, Parks can't conserve this culturally significant town. Yet Parks still insist BtS spend their money on insurance?

Some of you may be saying, "Why should Parks help? They can't support every little group around the country." enough, they can't.

Though Steiglitz is special. Nobody's asking Parks to fund relocation, or finance its long-term maintenance. BtS have a long history of fundraising capabilities. Also shire support, motivation, and a continual social connection to both school and town. This special building is part of their community.

Historical authorities agree. Numerous detailed management plans, academic papers, and reports confirm the importance of this town. Their expert opinions add weight to the worth of every building in Steiglitz. Especially the school.

Yet still, the cash-strapped custodians refuse to support BtS. Instead, the red-tape ridiculousness escalates.

This school needs both TLC and relocating. Presently isolated and continuously vandalized, BtS believe the school won't survive where it is. Parks acknowledge the situation is dire; yet want it left insitu. Completely ignoring the fact, it doesn't even sit on Park's land.

That's right. The building was moved in 1880. To land now owned by the Department of Environment, Land, Water & Planning (DELWP). DELWP gifted the school to BtS a few years ago. Though on one proviso; it be moved. For they want to sell the land.

So BtS searched for a new site. Everyone jumped on board -Shire, Engineers, locals, Architects, even politicians. After three years, BtS struck gold. In the heart of Steiglitz sat an unnamed dirt track. Big enough to put the school on. Eureka!

> Everyone thought it the perfect solution. Except Parks, who refuse to allot that, or any land, for relocation.

So what are BtS to do?

This historic school's survival is under threat. Put at risk by the very body charged with its protection; Parks Victoria. Everyone agrees, drastic action is needed...and needed now.

Parks could help, yet don't. Their PLI would enable BtS to continue raising money for all repairs to Steiglitz buildings...not just the school. While, assisting relocation


means they'd be saving part of Australia's history. Yet Parks only proffer BtS years of insurmountable obstacles; all wrapped in red tape. Where is the sense in this?

Dr. Fiona Gray (of Deakin University's Faculty of Science Engineering and Built Environment), in her recent paper on this very school, offers one explanation. Her work discusses difficulties faced when protecting historic buildings. How complications, such as cost and planning, can make custodial inertia an easier option then conservation. Dr. Gray asks whether this plays a role in the disrepair of many historic sites today. Posing an interesting question: should such custodial neglect be viewed as a form of demolition?

A question this red tape roundabout has BtS asking as well.

Peter Sharp advises BtS requested local State MHR Geoff Howard to write to the Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change, Lily d'Ambrosio on its behalf and as a result Parks Victoria will make a grant to cover the insurance for this year but in future BTS will have to pay the cost from its own funds.










Marie O'Connor remarked over several weeks, to her son Colin, that Lake Eyre was filling up. After a few weeks Colin asked her if she wanted to see it and she replied that she'd love to.

Marie hadn't travelled much. Colin remembered a seven day holiday along the Murray as their only family holiday when he was a kid, and a trip around Tasmania that his parents won. Colin drove his mother and father around Tasmania for a week. Maree hated the flight in the big aeroplane to Tasmania, so Colin was surprised that his mother even contemplated flying in a small aircraft to see Lake Eyre.

He contacted his mate Brendon Reidy, a licensed pilot from Colac, they hired a Cessna 172, picked Marie up and flew out of Lethbridge Airport on the Tuesday after the long weekend in June. It was slow going to Mildura. Into a strong head wind the trip took nearly 4 hours travelling at about 80 knots. They refuelled the plane and themselves there, headed for Leigh Creek and then on to Marree where they visited a museum about Tom Kruse the Outback Mailman and enjoyed a good meal amd accommodation in the local pub. The Finke Desert Race had just finished so there were many cars and bike riders still at Marree. Marie sat in the back seat of the plane and took a keen interest in everything, marvelling at the magnificent scenery including the Flinders Ranges, and loving everything!

Next morning, in beautiful weather they flew around both Lake Eyre North and South, across to William Creek Hotel for a counter meal lunch and back to Marree for the night. It was so calm that at times it was hard to determine where the water and the sky met because the sky was reflected in the water. They saw the rivers running water into the lakes, salt around the edges of the lakes and a spectacular rainbow that heralded the brewing storms.

On the flight home on the third day they literally "were flying" at about 150 knots with a tailwind, dodging thunderstorms all the way. At St Arnaud after flying over the Pyrenees they got clouded in, so landed, got picked up by family and driven home from there by car.

Marie who will celebrate her 87th birthday soon enjoyed every minute of the trip. She tells that it was time to do something as many of her friends are ill or have died. Colin hopes that she will fly to Perth soon to visit her sister, now she has found her wings.

Meredith POLICE news



Greetings to all readers of the Meredith and District newsletter.

I would really like to take this opportunity in thanking a local Meredith resident in contacting me on the 11th September, 2016 regarding what he saw on the Shelford Road, Meredith. The diligence of the male caller resulted in me locating and arresting a 26 year old Ballarat man who had been committing serious crime in Ballarat and Elaine.

Prior to me arresting the male, it is alleged that he was driving a stolen Holden Commodore sedan which was used when he allegedly committed aggravated burglaries in Elaine and Armed Robbery and Attempted Armed Robbery in Ballarat with the use of a Machete.

While looking for the male and the Silver Holden Commodore in the Elaine area I received further reports from other witnesses travelling along the Midland Highway suggesting that the suspect's driving was extremely dangerous.

In the end, and with the assistance of the diligent Meredith local, the offender was arrested without further incident on the Shelford Road at the Intersection of Lower Plains Road. I think this reinforces the need for community to work together and to contact police at times when you may see something that clearly is suspicious.

This male has been charged and remanded in custody to face a Ballarat Magistrates Court at a later date.

On Wednesday the 14th September I was called to assist SES and CFA in a rescue on the Shelford – Inverleigh Road where two occupants were trapped in their utility while attempting to cross a flooded river. I think this highlights the need to show all due care while driving in flood affected areas. Both parties were safely air lifted from the vehicle and re located to safety. This was a great multi agency response to a very dangerous situation.

I would ask residents to continue in their vigilance for any future incidents of crime and to contact police where necessary.

This can be done anonymously to Crime Stoppers on 1800 333000 to me at the Meredith Police Station by calling 52 861222 and leaving a voice message.





Dorothy's Kitchen Springs into Life!

The shop at 30 Staughton Street was Bobby Bell's Bootshop. He had boots in one window and a Douglas Motorcycle in the other. It is believed that the two buildings were shifted to Meredith from Steiglitz before the turn of the century. It was known for years as Fay's shop as the buildings were owned by Fay McFarlane and she had a Dressmaking Shop, then it was Mrs Elliott's haberdashery, Leslie Cox's haberdashery, Christine Stevenson's Dressmaking and Coolebarghurk Crafts run by Fay McFarlane and Fay Haywood before Brillee's Hardware and The Country Emporium.

Several families lived in the residence behind the shop including Bobby and Melva Goggin and Harold and Mary Donahue. With much flourish Andrew and Robert of the Country Emporium performed a superficial makeover before Graham H. Smith purchased the buildings in August 2014.

"What haven't we done to it?" Graham commented when asked what work had been done. From the foundations to the roof the buildings have virtually been rebuilt. Graham tells that there was no way that the builder Sefton Peters could quote for the job as no-one had any idea what was involved. Every board removed revealed another problem! Prior to any renovations the west wall was held up by ivy, the front left window was full of ivy growth, the paved courtyard was a foot under dirt, the residence swayed in the wind and had a lake of water where the floorboards should have been and the toilet was in the centre of the backyard.

Despite these "problems" Graham always thought "it had

a nice feeling" and that it had potential. What has been created is solid, attractive and versatile while retaining its old world charm.

Graham and his crew concentrated first on creating the kitchen and the bakery for "Meredith Baking Co" where Diane Dunne bakes delicious pastries, cakes and breads. Next they finished the Bed and Breakfast "Meredith Hideway" and the Beauty parlour, "Country Beauty Therapy" run by Jo Green.

Graham's son Anthony has designed the interior of the providore shop "Dorothy's Kitchen" to make it suitable to sell fresh locally sourced vegetables and fruit, and gourmet preserves, meat, cheese, pasta, and handcrafts. A highlight is their freshly milled in-store flour.

"Dorothy's Kitchen", named after Graham's late wife who was never happier than in the kitchen, opened for business on Saturday, August 20.

The sign was designed by Graham and his son Paul at the kitchen table one night and features a small bird sitting on the back of a sheep within the shop name in a circle.

The sheep is apt as Graham and his family came to Meredith in 1977, started "Meredith Wool" in 1980, built the wool store in Wallace Street and ran it for many years and he continues to buy and sell wool overseas and in Australia. These days he mainly trades "Downs Wool" that is used to make quilts. Graham is creating a photo book of the development. The bobcat inside the building is a good photo! Did he take a photo of the ivy growing inside? Graham tells that it has been fun!

Graham hopes to open the shop on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

October in the Garden

The rain, the rain. The earth is wetter than we have known it to be for a long time. While we are used to a brilliant spring garden here that prevails for several weeks usually from sometime through October and early November, the winter rain and this spring rain promises a particularly bountiful season. Lushness prevails in the home garden with vegies, herbs and flowering plants all bursting with life and vigor, fruit trees burgeoning with the promise of abundant crops, especially the stone fruits. Newly planted seeds of a variety of summer greens - lettuces, radicchio, endive, arugula - and carrots are pushing up through the soil. From now on I will stagger the planting of these seeds every four weeks or so to keep up a regular supply through the summer.

Usually we have quite late frosts here prohibiting the planting out of potatoes and tomatoes until around mid-November. However this year I am going to get some seed potatoes (*Solanum tuberosum*) in over the next few days. I'm going to plant them in a section of an old tank that has been cut into a few open ended containers, each about two feet high. This allows me to gradually build up a frost cover as the plants grow using a mixture of well-composted manures and vegetable matter mixed with pea straw. I have been convinced that it is wiser to plant seed potatoes rather than the old ones shooting in my pantry as seed potatoes promise to be disease free. If possible avoid planting potatoes in areas which you have limed previously as they like a PH of around 5.5 and more alkaline soils may encourage scab disease.

Many say that it's better to plant the whole potato, however an old farmer friend showed me the trick of cutting the seed potatoes in sections, each with an 'eye', and then coating the cut side with wood ash from the stove. The wood ash supplies potash required by potato plants and protects the cut potato in the soil. Place the potato section cut side down and cover with a layer of organic materials to a depth of about 20 cms. Keep the potatoes well-protected from sunlight as this causes greening. The potato plants will continue to push upwards to the light. When the flowers die off and the plant yellows then harvesting the crop should be as easy as pulling away the mulch and gently lifting out a delicious family of spuds.

When you are in your garden do you only see the jobs that have to be done? I am trying to BE in the garden and take pleasure in this glorious creation. Too often when standing and talking to a visitor I find myself bending over constantly to pull a few weeds and even moving around to check on something. Not just rude, but too obsessive to simply stand still, breathe in the garden deeply and enjoy the conversation.





Bushfire and Insurance

Julie Lee

This is the first in a series of articles focusing on living in bushfire zones, planning and insurance cover.

There are many factors that affect the cost of rebuilding after a fire and history has shown many residents are under insured. A new home today not only needs to comply with the new energy rating but to a BAL* construction level that is site dependant. There are other things to consider;

- cost to clear a site,
- replacing the slab/footings of sheds,
- fencing,
- a new septic system,
- underground power and new services connections as you may have to build somewhere else on your block.
- Architect or drafting fees
- Storage costs

Many insurance policies will cover out of pocket expenses for clearing the site, but are limited to 10% of the sum insured so you need to understand the full cost to know if you are covered. Temporary accommodation is covered by a percentage of the sum insured and may have time limits as well. If you run over time you may find that you need to find the money to cover these costs. Living on site while you rebuild is not possible if you are in the Golden Plains Shire and under a Bushfire Management Overlay; other shires do not have these restrictions.

How do you determine these costs?

 Use a reputable online calculator this will help to determine current building regulations for the size of your home. Remember to add in all other buildings and slabs and all ancillary items such as water tanks, solar panels etc.

- Secondly you need to have an understanding of the Bushfire Attack Level or BAL. This is a measure of the radiant heat that your home will need to stand in the event of a fire. Vegetation type and slope (effective slope) is the main parameter of how this is determined. Overestimate your BAL level if you are in doubt. (You can access a BAL self-assessment calculator at balreport.com.au Ed.)
- Refer to the ancillary costs such as cleaning up debris, accommodation what is paid out and for how long
- Allow for a new septic tank, underground power and for your plans to be drafted.
- If your property is in an extreme risk from flame attack during a fire you may be building to a FZ category and in this instance you may need to install a bunker to achieve compliance.

Finally look at your policy. Are you covered for fences, are you covered if part of your home is used as an office; see whether there are any other restrictions on your policy.

Children & Teens Cyber Safety

We now live in such a technically advanced world with home broadband access and smart phones and in most homes the kids know more about surfing the net and social media sites than parents do. Monitoring child and teen use of mobile phones and internet is a concern for many parents and they need to understand social media and chat sites and know what their children are viewing online. Most parents worry about how much time their teens spend on devices, what they access, who they meet online and online bullying.

There are many aspects to consider ensuring that your children and teenagers remain as safe as possible when using mobile and online devices. Here are some basic information to guide you;

Manage web connected devises at home

Parents can use parental control tools and safety settings on all devises in the home including, computers, laptops, tablets and phones. Even Playstation, Xbox and You Tube have age based settings and parental controls. They can keep children and teenagers safe by allowing parents to;

- block sexually explicit sites
- set screen time limits
- block in app purchases
- block numbers and SMS
- allow or block websites
- restrict chat features
- allow parental monitoring

Some safety advice for children and teens

Many children pester parents about opening social media accounts such as Facebook, Instagram or Snap Chat. Being mindful that these sites have age restrictions some starting at 13 years old we know that younger children still have accounts and have exposure to anyone of any age around the world. Teaching children and teens the following guidelines will assist them to be cautious and sensible social media members;

- join in and create your own account and be friends with yourchild or teen but be mindful not to cramp their style by commenting on conversations they engage with their friends unless it is unsafe
- learn as much as you can and keep up to date with popular media sites
- tell your kids not to share their passwords with friends and set their profile to private
- tell them not to post their full name, date of birth, phone number or address online and never post photos with house numbers, street names or in school uniform or anyway they could lead to stalking.
- encourage them not to accept "friend requests from people they do not know

- if they befriend someone who starts speaking to them in a way that makes them feel uncomfortable", they should tell a trusted adult
- advise them never to meet anyone online that they have not previously met in person
- most importantly, stipulate that they do not send via phone or post on social media any embarrassing photos of themselves, especially nude or semi nude. It is a crime and they may get into trouble with the police
- help them to report any cyber bullying they encounter



Moussaka Parcels

Prep time 40 minutes plus standing time Cooking time 40 minutes Serves 6

Ingredients

3 large eggplants

1 tablespoon olive oil

1 medium brown onion, chopped finely

2 cloves crushed garlic

1kg lamb mince

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1/4 cup tomato paste

½ dry red wine

700g bottled tomato pasta sauce

½ cup finely chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley

1/4 cup finely grated parmesan

Cheese Sauce Ingredients

50g melted butter

1/4 cup plain flour

1 ½ cups warm milk

1/4 cup finely grated parmesan cheese

1 egg beaten lightly

Method

Cut each eggplant lengthways into 10 thin slices, discard end pieces. Pan fry eggplant in batches in an oiled large frying pan on med-high heat until just starting to soften and colour up, drain on paper towel.

Heat oil in same pan, cook onion and garlic stirring until onion softens. Add mince and spices, cook stirring until browned. Add paste, wine and half the sauce. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat, simmer, covered 30 minutes. Uncover and simmer about 10 minutes or until sauce thickens slightly. Remove from heat, stir in parsley.

Meanwhile make cheese sauce.

Cheese Sauce:

Melt butter in saucepan, stir in flour until combined, cook on stove top stirring, for 2 mins. Remove from heat to gradually stir in milk small quantities at a time, continually stirring to ensure no lumps, until sauce thickens. Remove from heat, stir in cheese, then egg. (Do not replace back on stove top after this step)

Preheat oven to 180 C.

Lay two slices of eggplant side by side, slightly overlapping on a board, spread 1/3 cup lamb mixture across centre of the eggplant. Roll eggplant tightly to enclose filling, place seam side down in shallow ovenproof dish. Repeat with remaining eggplant and lamb mixture. Pour remaining tomato pasta sauce over eggplant parcels, top with cheese sauce, sprinkle with cheese and extra cinnamon. Bake uncovered 20 minutes until browned lightly.

Marg's look Review

"Burn" by James Patterson & Michael Ledwidge

"James Patterson books are like junk food....they taste good, it's hard to stop once you've started, and there's virtually no nutritional value." This quote came from a review that also stated that they're fairly predictable, not all that well-written, read like a cheesy action flick with a heart of gold most of the time.

"Burn" is the seventh book in the Michael Bennett series by prolific American author James Patterson. It is co-written with Michael Ledwidge. It is written in a relaxed style, in short chapters.

Detective Michael Bennett and his family of ten (adopted) children plus nanny, Mary Catherine and father, Seamus return to New York after nine months in witness protection. He finds himself demoted by the vindictive actions of a rival to Head of the Mayor's Ombudsman Outreach Squad. He quickly reforms this department of a "misfit new police team" before he is once again is called to the Major Crime Squad.

Combined with a legal challenge to his rights as an adoptive father, the fear of losing the family nanny and illness suffered by Seamus he gambles his reputation and his affections in a determined bid to do the right thing. He investigates several cases at the same time including a cadre of untouchable wealthy gourmet cannibals and an untraceable diamond heist team.

In other words he juggles home, work, love and politics. He is the good guy in a horrifying world of immorality, corruption and wickedness.

And as another reviewer stated, "As you dig deeper into the book the story begins to take a stranglehold on you".

I like to learn from reading. This book was action packed but I felt that I didn't learn anything. Others may be entertained by the book.

Vale Allan John McDonald

23/1/1942 - 15/8/2016

Allan was born near Winchelsea but moved to Soldier Settlement Block 3 which his father Peter had been allocated on Tall Tree Estate at Lethbridge, when he was seven years old. His

father Peter had enlisted for WW11, two months after Allan was born and was discharged in March 1945. A sister Joy was born to Peter and Mavis McDonald in November 1950 soon after they moved to the new farm at Lethbridge.

Allan rode his horse to Lethbridge State School and then went to Geelong College. Because the boarding house at the college was full he boarded with an elderly woman nearby who would go to her room after dinner at night, and leave her three young boarders to do what they liked. They liked to roam the streets of Geelong! Allan finished school a month before he was seventeen years old and came home to work on the farm. They grew a lot of onions in those days as well as running sheep and growing crops. Allan got on well with an older chap, Mr Reg Bath of Lethbridge, who worked for his father and learnt a lot from him. Allan started shearing locally also interstate.

Allan married Sandra in June 1968.

Although Sandra lived in Ivanhoe in Melbourne, they had met a couple of times because a cousin from Bannockburn knew them both. Sandra's mother took to Allan and invited him to visit and as Sandra tells "sort of brought them together". The Austin Healey sports car that Allan had bought may have been another attraction or him gallantly playing polo-cross or his ability as a ballroom dancer or his larrikin streak!

He had played football as a young man but by the time he got to his twenties he thought he should become serious about his work. Holidays were spent hunting for machinery or inspecting farming areas. He visited the cropping areas of Western Australia several times and there are many photos of Allan in paddocks of wheat. One exception to his life of work, work, and work was when he competed in the inaugural "King of the Mountain" at Wycheproof in 1978. He trained and thought he'd go well because he was wiry and strong but he didn't quite finish. He was delighted with his effort though because a well known Geelong strongman, the late Frogg Ritches, one time anchor man for the World of Sport tug-of-war, had thrown his bag of wheat down before Allan on the 1km track up the world's smallest mountain.

Allan and Sandra rented a small house on a property nearby to the McDonalds farm. It was quite lonely for Sandra until Lorraine Scanlon, a local woman introduced Sandra to others and invited her to functions at Lethbridge. She also got a job as a Law Clerk in Geelong until their sons were born, Eden in 1970 and Ashley in 1972. She returned to work during the 1982 drought when they decided that one of them needed to get a paid

Allan gave up interstate shearing after the birth of his first son but continued shearing locally. He had a passion for machinery which he made and modified. He share farmed and leased many properties including 1500 acres at Stuart Mill from 1974. Sandra remembers slowly following big machines, with two small, lively boys aboard, to and from Stuart Mill. It was horrendous!

Allan and Sandra bought several farming blocks of land over the years and after his father died in 1988 he took over the farm on Tall Tree Road. Allan developed one block they bought on Lower Plains Road into a bluestone quarry and later sold it.

The highlight of Allan's farming career came in 1993 when he won the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria' Champion Exhibit of Barley from a high rainfall zone. He also won a


Bronze Award for malting barley in medium to higher rainfall zone.

When Allan was 49 years old he became ill. After extensive tests it was determined that he Myelofibrosis, a blood disease. For 25 years he endured tests, doctor and hospital visits, medicines, injections but carried on with his life as best he could. Six months before he died Allan was told he needed a bone marrow transplant but that he was too frail to survive it. Sandra tells that he accepted his condition, never complained and tended to worry about little things but not about the big stuff. He had recovered from so many health crises over the years that the family were stunned when he died at 2.10 am on Monday, August 15.

A funeral service was held on Monday, August 22 at St Joseph's Catholic Church, Meredith followed by the internment service at the Lethbridge Cemetery.

As winter ends, small leaves sprout from the earth, some long

and narrow with pointed tips, hairy or shiny and reaching upwards; others long, tubular and vertical like a chive leaf; and many close to the ground, broad and rounded or pointed, or shaped like a heart with purple underneath, single or in rosettes. Many small tubers that spent summer dormant, surviving the heat and dry, have responded to cooler, wetter weather and have sprung to life. Now is the time for them to grow and send up stalks with their small, fascinating orchid flowers. There are many species of native orchids in Victoria, and the Brisbane Ranges is noted for them. They are not big and showy like cultivated orchids, but are just as beautiful and far more varied. They can be any colour of the rainbow, and some colours not included in it.

Some, such as the sun orchids, with flowers more likely to open on warm sunny days, are of a similar shape to more familiar flowers, but others are far more bizarre.

One of the more unusual orchids, and also one of my favourites, is the flying duck orchid. Each tuber grows a narrow green to red-brown leaf close to the ground. They can be seen now, forming colonies, often at the base of large trees in very poor soil. The shiny brown flowers appear in early summer with one or more on a stalk usually 20-30cm tall. Each flower is shaped so that it has a body, outstretched wings, long curved neck, head and bill, looking just like a miniature flying duck. Most orchids are pollinated by insects, and instead of offering a reward of nectar, many use tricks to attract them. Flying duck orchids entice male sawflies. Like some other orchids, it either produces a scent similar to the pheromones of a female of the species, or part of the flower looks like her. The male lands on the head of the duck hoping to mate with her. The head snaps downwards against the body of the duck, trapping the insect. As it moves inside the flower, bundles of pollen stick to it. Within thirty minutes, the flower reopens, releasing the sawfly to carry its pollen to another flower.

Another group of orchids that deceive male insects in this way are the greenhoods. The flowers grow on stalks and have a hood of green, often with white stripes or touches of brown. They may appear to have horns standing up beside the hood. The most common and obvious of these are nodding greenhoods which grow in large colonies. The rosettes of leaves appear in autumn. If you return to them in late winter, you'll find the first flowers. Most greenhoods have upright hoods, but the flowers of nodding greenhoods droop or nod towards the ground. After pollination, the plants produce upright capsules. Stalks continue to grow, pushing capsules up, so when vertical splits form in their sides, the dust-like seeds can more easily spread on the breeze. As the weather becomes hotter and drier, the plants turn brown and die. Once the capsules have gone there will be no trace of the plants above

ground until next autumn. Not all orchids trick insects. A few offer nectar. Some pollinate themselves, produce seed without pollination or spread by tubers.

Native orchids come in many shapes. Those with small brown flowers, such as gnat, mayfly and mosquito orchids resemble insects. Midge orchids are so tiny they are extremely difficult to find. Other brown orchids look like tiny helmets or baby birds, mouths wide open begging for food. A few orchids have beards. Some appear to have fingers of pink, blue or white. Spider orchids are green, red and white with stripes on the five long 'legs'. Wax-lip orchids spread patches of five-petalled purple flowers through the bush. Onion orchid leaves resemble chives. From each leaf grows a spike of tiny green

flowers. The Diuris group has beautiful yellow flowers with 'ears' sticking up or to the side. They are often marked with brown or orange and named after leopards, moths, hornets and wallflowers. One of the year's last orchids is the hyacinth orchid which sends a dark brown stalk up to one metre tall with many pink spotted and striped flowers. A few orchids flower in spectacular numbers after fire, but rarely at other times. Orchids are small treasures waiting to be admired, but please don't pick them. They are protected by law and it is best to leave them to reproduce.



CONLEY'S HOTEL, ELAINE

About five weeks ago Conley's hotel was destroyed by fire, and the owner and licensees were desirous of rebuilding the hotel and continuing business. The hotel was situated near the Elaine railway station, about 100 yards distant from the Railway hotel. Mr J. Farly appeared for the owner (Ernest Higgins), and Mr R. J. Gribble for the licensee.

Const Searle stated the structure which was burnt down was of brick, and very old, but fairly well furnished. One hotel was, in his opinion, sufficient. The Railway hotel there was extremely clean and well furnished. It was also conducted fairly well. Conley's hotel was conducted in a way that elicited complaints during the past 18 months. Witness had spoken to licensee's husband about Sunday and after hours trading, and he said he would see witness was not troubled again.

To Mr Gribble: There was farming and grazing in the district. He had not heard of a proposed further cutting up of estates there. During the winter season nine days' coursing was annually held. There was then a good demand for accommodation. Witness had not seen a horse in Mr Hickey's stable. Witness had not heard of dancing having taken place at the hotel.

To Insp Nicholson: He had received no complaints about the other hotels in his district.

After hearing further evidence the bench adjourned the Court till to-day, at 10 a.m., when the decisions will be announced.

The Ballarat Courier 22 February 1917

The Licenses Reduction Board at its deprivation sittings held at Ballarat on Thursday announced that it had decided to close the Lal Lal Falls Hotel, Lal Lal, and Conley's Hotel, Elaine, both of which are in the Buninyong licencing district, owing to their not being required for the convenience of the public. There are other hotels in the townships named. Conley's Hotel was destroyed by fire some months ago, and the board refused to issue a licence for new premises. The matter of compensation to owners and licensees will be decided at a future sitting of the board.

A Treasured Bible

Matilda Muir was given a small bible, about 10 cm long, 6 cm wide and 2 cm thick in a case which is thought to be made of dog or pig skin. The inscription on the inside cover reads "Presented to Matilda Muir by J.M." The opposite page records that James Maxwell Murdoch was born at Renfrewshire, Scotland on the 17th day of March, 1828 and underneath is recorded that Matilda Muir was born at Kilmarnock on the 1st day of January 1833. Presumably the small Bible in the case was a present from husband James Murdoch to his wife Matilda Muir on their wedding day at Busby Presbyterian Church, Renfrewshire, Scotland on March 31, 1853.

The small Bible which has a green velvet cover, gold edged pages and a brass clasp also records the births and deaths of several of their children including John Murdoch b. 1854 at Campbell's Creek, d. 1855, Isabella Murdoch b.1856 at Simmons Reef, Blackwood, Anne and Maria Murdoch b. 1858 at Buninyong, John James Murdoch b. 1860 at Stoney Rises, d. 1862, Jane Maxwell Murdoch b. 1863 at Stoney Rises, John Murdoch b. 1864 at Stoney Rises and also the death of her husband James in 1864 aged 37 years. He is buried in the Meredith Cemetery. A large stone memorial which is leaning against the wrought iron fence records that the memorial was "Created by Matilda in Memory of her Beloved Husband James Maxwell Murdoch, a Native of New Cathcart, Scotland who departed his life at Stoney Rises, January 20, 1865 in the 36 year of his age."

The Muir family lived over the road from where the Recreation Reserve at Elaine is today where a clump of pine trees still stand. James Murdoch was a baker and storekeeper and his quite substantial premises were on the south side of the Morrisons Road, adjacent to where the highway is today. Peter Wells remembers the shop and residence was right on the fence line. The bakery was separate with the counter, scales and baker's oven, and the delivery carts were housed in the sheds out the back. Today a few bricks in the corner of the paddock mark the spot where James Murdoch ran a thriving business. He had decided to make his money by catering to the miners rather than trying his luck in the field. Peter tells that the buildings sort of vanished over time.

Matilda remarried to a Mr William Crowe and they had two children, Minnie who died in 1877 at 8 years of age and Thomas Crowe b. 1872 at Elaine. Peter Wells thinks that William Crowe ran the Railway Hotel in Elaine. After he died Matilda carried on running the hotel, the bakery and the store for a time. (A James Crowe had the Elaine Hotel in 1872 & 1873.) The relations of Thomas Crowe gave the small diary to Peter Wells, who is great grandson of Matilda Muir, about twenty years ago.

Matilda and William Crowe are buried together in the Meredith Cemetery.

Their graves are unmarked but there are only two plots between Matilda and her first husband. William Crowe died on December 6, 1877 and Matilda died on October 17, 1931 at 99 years 9 months of age.




